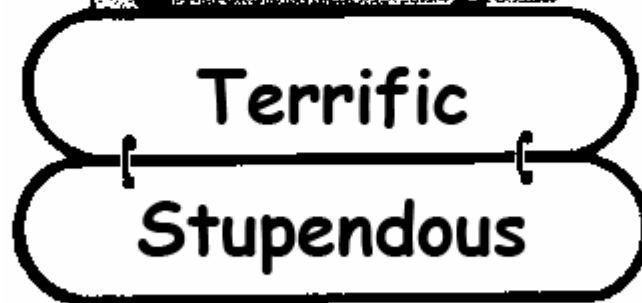
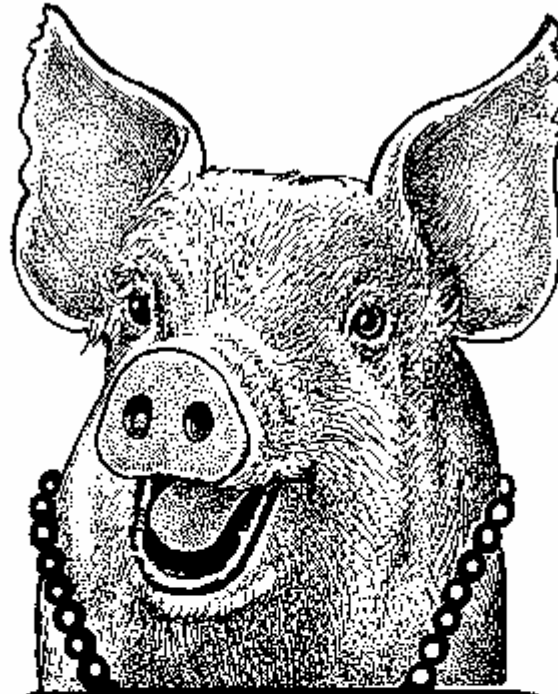

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations will apply to each and every department of the Fair and exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules.

SECTION 1: INTERPRETATIONS, AMENDMENTS & VIOLATIONS

- Rule 1 The Red River Parish Fair reserves to its Board the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.
- Rule 2 The management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as it may deem advisable, in the event of general and special rules, the latter will govern.

SECTION 2: ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Rule 1 The management reserves the right to reject any entry offered. The management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit that may be falsely entered or deemed unsuitable or objectionable; or to remove any sign, banner or advertising matter of any kind which may be deemed objectionable by it, without assigning a reason.
- Rule 2 All exhibits must be made and prepared by the exhibitor.
- Rule 3 All entries, except livestock, must be registered with the entry clerks, who will issue an entry tag showing the entry number. The entry clerks will have an office on the Fairgrounds **Monday, Sept. 29 and Tuesday, Sept. 30, 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**
- Rule 4 **All exhibits, except livestock, must be entered by 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 30, and in place ready to be judged one hour before time of judging.**
- Rule 5 All exhibits must be entered in the name of the owner, but the owner's name cannot be displayed on the exhibit until after the same has been judged unless otherwise stated in Department rules.
- Rule 6 Exhibits for competition may not bear advertising or tags as to quality, service, ownership, etc. Such items will be considered commercial and must be cleared through proper authorities for space at the Red River Parish Fair.

SECTION 3: EXHIBITORS' DUTIES AND PRIVILEGES

- Rule 1 If it is ascertained that any exhibitor had made or caused to be made any false statements in regard to any animal or article, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, he shall be excluded from competition or exhibition on the grounds of the Fair Association.
- Rule 2 Exhibitors will be given a duplicate entry check and this check must be presented to secure return of entry at the close of the Fair.
- Rule 3 **Every exhibit must remain intact through Saturday, October 4 or forfeit premiums. Entries will be released and can be picked up Sunday, Oct. 5, 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.**
- Rule 4 Exhibitors must promptly claim and remove their property at the close of the fair.

SECTION 4: LIABILITY OF EXHIBITORS

- Rule 1 All property of every character entered for competition, display or other purposes or being anywhere in the Fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of the Red River Parish Fair Association.
- Rule 2 All exhibits entered are at the risk of the exhibitor. Neither the Red River Parish Fair nor any of its representatives are responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits. Proper care will be exercised by the fair management to protect exhibits.

SECTION 5: AWARDS AND PREMIUMS

- Rule 1 Judging is not open to public.
- Rule 2 The judges will award premiums only on articles listed in the premium list.
- Rule 3 The decision of a judge shall be final and no appeal will be considered except in case of a written protest.
- Rule 4 No premium will be awarded when the entry is unworthy, although there was no competition. At the discretion of the Judge, exhibitors may be awarded a second or lesser placing. Unworthy exhibits will have to be removed.
- Rule 5 Judges will be furnished by the LSU Agricultural Center Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service or as can be secured elsewhere.
- Rule 6 Inasmuch as it is easy for tags and ribbons to be removed from one exhibit to another, all awards will be made strictly from the Judges' books, which are accepted as the only true records of premium awards.
- Rule 7 Premiums will be paid only for exhibits produced or made during 2008 except in stated cases.
- Rule 8 All premiums will be paid and awards given around **noon Saturday, October 4.**
- Rule 9 **NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS:** If the financial condition of the Red River Parish Fair Association permits, 100% of the listed premiums will be paid to exhibitors. However, the Fair Association reserves the right to adjust these premiums according to available funds.

SECTION 6: PROTESTS & APPEALS

- Rule 1 All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, which deposit will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. The protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Board of Directors within five hours after completion of judging. It must contain at least one specific charge stating at length all facts relied upon or the rules violated and naming witnesses by whom proof is to be made.
- Rule 2 No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article will be considered by the management.
- Rule 3 The right of an exhibitor to appeal from the decision of a judge to the Board will be only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit, or when it is charged that the decision of the judge has been influenced or interfered with.
- Rule 4 All questions of disputes not provided for under these rules shall be referred to by the Board of Directors of the Red River Parish Fair Association, whose decision shall be final.
- Rule 5 In addition to the right of protest guaranteed to exhibitors, the Directors reserve the right to take cognizance of fraud consummated or attempted in connection with an exhibit and take such action as may be deemed just and proper and as may be warranted by the premises.

SECTION 7: STATE FAIR ENTRIES

- Rule 1 Winning exhibits that CAN be entered at the State Fair will be marked by department superintendent for entry in the Louisiana State Fair. Objections must be made by the exhibitor to entry clerks when items are entered.

STATEMENT OF POLICY:

The Red River Parish Fair is a public institution, existing for the benefit of the public, and reserves the right to refuse admission to the Fairgrounds of those who are intoxicated, or in any other way considered undesirable for public safety and morals. Positively no beer or other intoxicating drinks will be allowed to be sold or consumed on the grounds.

SPECIAL LIVESTOCK NOTICE

1. Unless otherwise specified, the Red River Parish Fair will follow the rules set up in the LSU Livestock Show catalog for the beef, dairy, sheep, goat and swine shows and the LSU State Horse Show for the horse show.
2. CURRENT health papers are required on all animals entered at the fair.
3. All classes of this division are open for competition to bona fide members of a 4-H Club or FFA Club.
4. **All livestock entries must be pre-entered to the LSU AgCenter La Cooperative Extension Service, Red River Parish office, P. O. Box 1364, Coushatta, LA 71019, by Thursday, September 19**
5. All stock must be in the barns by 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 1, and weighed by 8:00 p.m.
6. All stock must remain in barns until 10:00 p.m., Saturday, Oct. 4 and be picked up by 2.00 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 5, as deemed by the Junior Livestock Executive Committee.
7. Registration papers must accompany all animals competing in registered class.
8. All cattle on exhibit must be on halter.
9. Each livestock exhibitor will be responsible for feeding, watering, and caring for their livestock for the
10. duration of the Fair.
11. The feeding and watering troughs and buckets will also be furnished by the exhibitor.
12. Feed and water shall be removed from in front of animals, except while attended by the exhibitor.
13. Feed will be furnished by the exhibitor.
14. Each exhibitor will be responsible for preparing their animals for showing.
15. Decisions by the judges are final.
16. The Junior Livestock Executive Committee has the right to change, interpret, amend, add, delete, etc.
17. any rules it may deem necessary according to circumstances.
18. Suggestions for improving the Livestock Division will be considered by the Jr. Livestock Executive Com.
19. All exhibitors shall exhibit and show their own animals in Junior Division.
20. All worthy placing below 3rd will receive a \$3.00 premium unless otherwise stated.
21. An exhibitor must show his own animal for Showmanship.
22. December 31 of the current year will be the base date for determining exhibitor age in showmanship.
23. Judge recommendations will be voted on by the Junior Livestock Executive Committee.
24. Work assignments which include announcer, ring steward, paddock master, clerks and award presenters will also be made by the Junior Livestock Committee.
25. See general rules and regulations. Also see State Fair of Louisiana catalog for possession dates, etc.

Wholesome Assurance Statement

ATTENTION: The use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law.

*NOTE: Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.

Any food animal must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA-established tolerances for any foreign substance (identified or unidentified) including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals. Violative results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA for prosecution. Any misrepresentation of a food animal that can potentially affect acceptability of the carcass will be considered fraud.

The MANUAL OF MEAT INSPECTION PROCEDURES OF THE USDA states that carcasses must be free of actionable levels of antibiotics, hormones, or pesticide-chemicals to pass as safe and wholesome food. Detection of illegal residues of these substances may lead to stiff penalties on the part of the producer. Therefore, label instructions, precautions, warnings and withdrawal periods must be carefully followed.

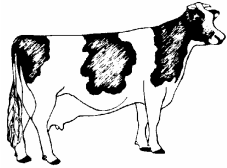

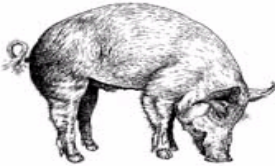

Section 1 – Registered Ewes – Junior Division

Classes will be divided by breeds and ages.

- J1-1 Ewe Lamb Class – must have all their baby teeth (no evidence of eruption of permanent teeth allowed)
- J1-2 Yearling Ewe Class – must have evidence of eruption of one or both of first pair of incisors (two tooth class) may not have evidence of more than two permanent teeth
- J1-3 Aged Ewe Class – must have evidence of eruption of four to six permanent teeth

Section 2 – Commercial Ewes – Junior Division

- 1. Ewes showing in the Commercial Ewe classes cannot be entered or shown in the Market Lamb division or Registered Breeding Ewe division.
- 2. All commercial ewes must have an ear tag for identification in the class.
- 3. All breeds and crosses are allowed in the Commercial Ewe Show.
