Shop downtown at the **E.W. Merritt Pavilion**. Vendors featuring hand crafted items such as ironworks and original art, and a large assortment of plants and garden accessories will be showcasing their treasures.

Come early to get a homemade tea cake, or enjoy food from **Key Rail Barbeque** and the **Gibsland Grill**.

Visit exhibits in the **Gibsland Bank Annex** and hear Mr. Richard Johnson, from the Caroline Dormon Nature Preserve speak about *Native Plants in the Landscape*. Learn about herbs and camellias from Master Gardeners, and get your own plant identified.

Also open for tour in the festival area is the **Bonnie and Clyde Museum L.L.C.**, **The Authentic Bonnie and Clyde Museum**, the **Barbara Van Cleave Joiner Memorial Garden** and the **Burkhalter Gazebo**, which features a wide variety of gorgeous daffodils.

Come downtown early and enjoy the Jonquil Jubilee Pancake Breakfast with the **Gibsland Lions Club**. Pancakes and sausage are available from 8 a.m. – 10 a.m. in the Gibsland Lions Club building for \$5.00.

### Tours and Attractions

With your \$10.00 ticket you'll receive a map and directions to the following attractions. Begin at any location and travel at your own pace. Tour sites are open from 10:00a.m. till 4:00p.m.

Hop on board two **L&NW** locomotive engines and learn about the importance of the railroad to Gibsland throughout the years.

J.R. Johnson and his wife Jan McLeish Johnson invite you to visit "**Cedar Ridge**", a Cajun style cabin built in 2006 on the Johnson's original home place. With its whimsical, as well as eclectic décor, it will surely capture your heart!

Drive by **Sally's Field**, a display featuring over 6000 daffodils identified by name and cultivar. Stop and enjoy a walking tour at **Oak Grove Farm** where fields of bulbs have been planted for generations.

View fields of daffodils at **Willow Oaks Farm**, the home of Shirley and Wayne Carter, and walk through the fields next door at the home of Lorris and Elaine Carter.

Visit Russell and Sue Kettler's **Blacksmith Shop** and watch demonstrations that will take you back in time.

Other stops include the oldest continuously operated Baptist Church in LA, **Mt. Lebanon Baptist Church** established in 1837; **Mt. Lebanon Stagecoach Trail Museum**; and **Mt. Lebanon Cemetery**, the burial place of many confederate soldiers.



Visit the Gibsland and Mt. Lebanon cemeteries, and take a walk back in time as your guide reveals some of the colorful stories from the histories of these neighboring areas.
