at your Louisiana location!




When you're planning, building or insuring a home, it's important to know your exposure to natural hazards such as floods and high winds.

Throughout Louisiana, building to minimize flood and wind damage is a code requirement .

Use this online tool to study conditions at your site or to explore how flood maps are changing in your parish.

Choose the "Hybrid" view to find your house on an aerial photograph.


Side 2 shows how to overlay old/new maps to see flood zone changes that happen when maps are revised.

Using the LSU AgCenter **Floodmaps** portal to explore map changes at your point of interest.

Above: Side by side views of the Effective FIRM (left) and Preliminary Digital FIRM (right) in the vicinity of New Roads in Pointe Coupee Parish. A-Zones on the Effective FIRM are colored gray; A-Zones on the Preliminary Digital FIRM are outlined in aqua and shaded with blue dots.

Below: The two views from above are overlaid by checking both boxes (Preliminary DFIRM and Effective FIRM) at the top-right of the map screen.

The point indicated by the red-headed pin (circled) is in Zone AE on the Effective FIRM but will be in Zone-X if the Preliminary Map is adopted. The area in the extreme lower right is OUT but will be newly IN Zone AE.
