Directions:

From Bastrop, LA:

Follow LA-2 East, turn right onto LA-17 until you reach Oak Grove, then make a left at the Thomas Jason Lingo Community Center, 10284 Louisiana Hwy. 17, Oak Grove, LA 71263.

From Monroe, LA:

Travel I-20 East; take Exit 153 toward Delhi/Winnsboro; keep left toward Delhi; turn left onto LA-17 and turn right at the Thomas Jason Lingo Community Center, 10284 Louisiana Hwy. 17, Oak Grove, LA 71263.

From Monticello, AR:

Go south east on AR-35 approximately 24 miles. Turn right onto US-65 S. Turn right onto E. Armstrong St/AR-8. Turn left onto S. Main St/ AR-159. Turn right onto Lee St/AR-159. Take the 1st left onto S. Archer St./AR-159, crossing into Louisiana (AR-159 becomes LA-17). Turn right onto W. Main St/ LA-2. Turn right onto Hwy 879/LA-879. Turn right onto Bran Rd. Turn left at the Thomas Jason Lingo Community Center, 10284 Louisiana Hwy. 17, Oak Grove, LA 71263.

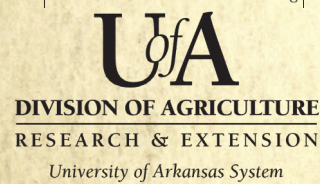
