

Pollination Chart for Pecan Cultivars

Pecan trees are cross-pollinated between cultivars. Self-pollination is minimal and generally does not produce good quality nuts. A more detailed explanation of cross-pollination can be found on the Pecan Research-Extension Station's FAQs page describing the difference between protandrous and protogynous trees.

This chart is meant to provide pollination information on a number of pecan cultivars. If the pollen shed of one cultivar significantly overlaps the pistil receptivity of another cultivar, then that cultivar should be a pollinator.
