



Parent Info-Guide

Attending summer camp at Grant Walker is the highlight of so many Louisiana 4-H youth, and adults. Although our beloved Camp Grant Walker is not quite ready to welcome visitors yet, this year we are leaving Pollock, Louisiana and coming to your parish!

Camp Grant Walker is pleased to offer a Traveling Road Show Day Camp during the months of June and July. This collaborative effort between a hosting parish 4-H program(s) and Camp Grant Walker programming staff and resources will provide a mini camping experience for our 4-H members in the 4th through 6th grades. Each camp offers non-formal education and engaging recreational activities for the youth of participating parishes.

Features of the Traveling Road Show Day Camp

- Provides an opportunity for approximately **50-75** youth to safely participate in a day camp within, or in a neighboring, parish. *Specific capacity will depend on restrictions of each reserved facility.*
- Eliminates need to arrange for transportation of youth to and from camp.
- Activities are designed to allow for great interaction, while maintaining necessary social distancing.

Pick-Up/Drop-Off Procedures

Drop-Off Procedures

Upon arrival, there will be a series of stops to complete check-in. Parents will be required to stay in their vehicles at all times. **Carpooling is strongly discouraged.** Temperature checks and symptom screening will be performed. No participant (youth/adult) will be accepted with a temperature over the current mandated temperature threshold. During drop-off, parents will receive a CGW camper card that will have the camper's name and the parent/guardian authorized to pick up the camper. Campers will also be assigned to their color-coded "Pod" for the day. Siblings and those residing in the same household will be assigned to the same pod.

*Parent/Guardian MUST show camp card to designated AgCenter staff when they arrive to pick up the camper.
NO EXCEPTIONS*

Check-In and Out

- Only one parent be present for check-in and check-out.
- Before campers get out of the vehicle at check-in, we will ask the following questions:
 - Has the camper had a fever in the last 14 days?
 - Any COVID related symptoms? (coughing, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of taste or smell, etc.)
 - Traveled outside the state or country? If so, document where and when.
 - Been in contact with anyone that tested positive within the last 14 days?
- Campers will get out of the vehicle to have their temperatures taken. If anyone has a temperature over 100.4, they cannot stay at camp and can only return if they receive a negative test result. CGW will abide by the government mandated temp threshold at that time.
- Once campers check-in, they will go to their assigned pod group and remain with them until pick-up time.

Please note that any guidelines may be updated based on the most current health and safety recommendations from state and federal governmental officials



Safety Measures in Place

During the **2021 4-H Traveling Road Show Day Camp Program**, multiple Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPIs) will be employed in order to keep campers, volunteers, and all other participants safe and healthy. Backed by the most current research, the purpose of these measures is to reduce potential transmission and exposure of the COVID-19 virus. Parishes are encouraged to co-host events, however, campers will be separated by parish in order to further reduce potential spread. The following list describes the various aforementioned countermeasures:

- **Masks** – masks must be triple layer; Note: If you can see light through the mask, it is too thin!
- **Physical Distancing** – Campers, volunteers, and staff will be required to socially distance from each other, providing a minimum of 6 feet between each individual
- **Pods/Cohorts** – Campers will be isolated to color-coded cohort groups, or “Pods”, to reduce potential transmission and to encourage social distancing.
- **Modified Lunch Procedures** – Campers will eat lunch according to Pods, and will remain socially distanced. This may result in multiple phases during dining operations.
- **Modified Programmatic Format** – Campers will participate in small recreation and track groups, in addition to physical distancing and pod-isolated groups. Thorough cleaning procedures will be completed during each rotation between stations.
- **Screening Procedures** – Temperature and symptom checks will be performed during camper check-in.
- **Cleaning** – High touch surfaces, especially lesson materials and supplies, will be thoroughly disinfected between each station rotation.

Important Screening Considerations

Due to the ongoing nature of the global COVID-19 pandemic, some circumstances might prohibit campers from attending the day camp. If any of the following circumstances apply to your child or your family, we must regretfully request that you decline to participate in the 2021 4-H Traveling Road Show Day Camp Program:

- Suspected camper exposure to COVID-19 in Last 14 Days
- Pre-Disposition to Viral Illnesses
- Presence of Immuno-Compromised Family Members
- Fever or Flu-Related Symptoms in Last 14 Days
- Traveled Outside of State in Last 14 Days
- Been in Contact with An Individual Who Tested Positive in Last 14 Days
