

The Louisiana 4-H Camp Counselor Program



Overview

The Louisiana State University AgCenter takes seriously its obligation to provide a safe, positive environment for the youth. Teen leaders play a critical role in supporting educational experiences that develop life skills and character traits. They serve as positive role models and provide invaluable assistance to youth and adults in planning, implementing and evaluating educational experiences.

The camp counselor role is an important role in the 4-H program. Once prepared to serve in a leadership role, many opportunities will be available to you. Through this training you will learn and develop individually and in turn help to teach and guide others. A good teen leader or counselor is an asset of the 4-H Youth Development program. An untrained or unprepared teen leader or counselor can be more of a barrier than an asset. This program is designed to help with the leadership development of teens to serve in the role of camp counselors.

Directions for Online Training

1. Go to learn.lsuagcenter.com
2. Log on using a google ID. (See “Enrolling in 4-H Online Training” if you need assistance in this process.)
3. Click on 4-H.
4. Click on “Camp Counselor Training”.
5. You will be prompted to enter a key which is LACCT.



Inside the 4-H Camp Counselor Program

1. Complete all ten of the interactive training modules. You do not have to complete them all at one time. You may work at your own pace. You can access a printable PDF version of the training modules. This can be helpful when you go to take your quiz.
2. You need to take the comprehensive quiz after the lesson when indicated. There are six quizzes total. You will have 3 attempts and an unlimited amount of time to take the quiz and get a 90% or better score.
3. Once you have taken all six quizzes with a 90% or better you can access your certificate and give a copy to your parish 4-H Youth Development Agent.

 - 3 hours on-line and 3 hours on-site
 - OR**
 - 6 hours on-site
- Complete the Louisiana 4-H Camp Counselor Training.
- Complete the Camp Counselor Application.
- Sign the Code of Conduct.
- Give all paperwork to your 4-H agent.
