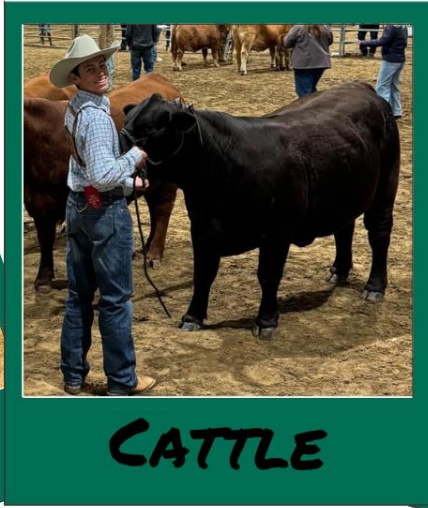
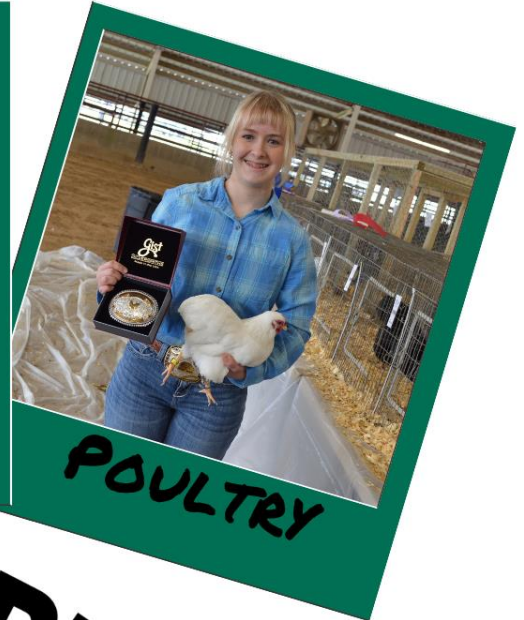

2026 Livestock Show Catalog

The LSU Livestock Show catalog is available to clientele on the LSU AgCenter's website at https://www.lsuagcenter.com/portals/our_offices/departments/livestock-show-office/livestock.

You can also find a tentative species schedule for the 2026 State Livestock Show there as well.

Please read through the LSU State Livestock Shows 2026 Catalog for all rules and guidelines regarding the state show (changes from previous year are in red) as they have gone through a thorough revision process to better assist exhibitors and their families with their projects.

HARDSHIP POLICY

If a 4-H or FFA livestock project cannot be housed at your home or family property, the exhibitor must file a hardship request for special housing. The request must be made and approved prior to possession date. If this request is not made before the possession date, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show at the parish, district, and state livestock shows. No exceptions will be made, so please contact the 4-H office to get a form. Once filled out, please return to the 4-H office, and Ms. Dani will start the process of getting it approved on the parish, district, and state levels. Approval is solely based on the information provided on the hardship form, so please be thorough with the details provided and ensure that the reader understands that the exhibitor will still be present with all aspects of his/her project frequently (see LSU livestock show rules for exhibitor responsibilities). All Livestock Exhibitors

It is time to begin planning for the LSU AgCenter Spring Shows.

This year the LSU AgCenter will again use the online system for all shows and exhibitors. This means we must work together to navigate these changes. The best way for you to reach me with questions and/or troubleshooting through this process is through our livestock remind group. Enclosed are instructions on how to join.

We will again use the fair entry livestock show program moving forward. Fair Entry is compatible with 4-HOnline and works in unison to make gathering information easier for exhibitors and staff. Even though separate entities, both Fair Entry and 4HOnline will work together to accomplish our livestock show needs. 4-HOnline facilitates enrollment and gathering of animal information; animal information MUST be entered into the 4HOnline system by exhibitors before or on the possession date or validation date for each animal. When show entry time comes around (likely November/December for most) Fair Entry will facilitate the exhibitor's entry into shows using the exhibitor's animals' information previously entered into 4-H Online.

The first step this year is registration through 4-HOnline. All Exhibitors (Even FFA Only) must create a 4-H Online profile. If you are only joining FFA please select FFA- School Name as your club when registering.

No animal will be allowed entry if it is not entered into the 4-H Online System by the Deadlines.

Your first step is to enter your animal's information using the 4HOnline program. Exhibitors can go to their profile (once enrollment has been approved) in 4HOnline to enter their animal information by logging into 4HOnline just as they did when enrolling. This process was designed to be user-friendly and uses drop-down boxes for the most part.

For all registered breeding animals, the exhibitor will enter animal information into the 4HOnline system on or before the animal's possession deadline. The exhibitor will also be required to upload registration papers by the possession deadline or if papers are PENDING our NEW Registration Papers Pending form will need to be uploaded in the place of the Registration Papers. For Pending papers also use pending as the registration number instead of a random made-up number. (For exhibitors still waiting on Registration papers, the paper must be received in the Acadia 4-H Office no later than 30 days after the possession deadline.)

The LSU Livestock Show has issued a new rule regarding late registration papers (see 2026 show catalog for official LSU show rules). The catalog states that registration papers must be received no later than 30 days from the possession deadline. ABSOLUTELY NO REGISTRATION PAPERS will be accepted after January 3, 2026. Registration papers that are received after the 30-day possession deadline, until January 3, 2026, will result in the exhibitor paying a fine of \$250 per animal, to their district show manager. Without registration papers you will not be

eligible to show your breeding animals. The registration papers must be a correct official registration with the exhibitor as owner must be submitted.

Exhibitors will not have access to enter animals into the 4HOnline system after the possession deadline.

For market and/or commercial breeding animals the exhibitor will also be required to go into the 4HOnline system to enter animal information on or before validation deadlines. This part of the validation process will be in addition to submitting DNA/hair samples and validation fees to Agents and Ag Teachers by validation deadlines. Exhibitors will not have access to enter animals into the 4HOnline system after the possession deadline.

All animals (breeding and market) must be entered in 4HOnline by the possession /validation deadline for that species. Animals requiring validations will only be approved after agents have received the validation envelope, card, and payment for the respective animal.

4HOnline is not a tailor-made program and as such certain form fields had to be adapted. There are descriptions specifying what is needed in each field, but sometimes these descriptions are in smaller print and may not always be easily read. The list of these changes is as follows:

Home Raised is for Louisiana Bred. Select “Yes” if the animal is LA Bred.

License Number is for the Louisiana Bred Tag Number.

Tag would be the leg band number

Colors and Markings are the Variety/Color (i.e. – white, blue, barred, buff, etc.)

The type of Poultry is whether the bird is Standard or Bantam.

POSSESSION DATES FOR BREEDING ANIMALS

Possession Dates: **(Animals must be in continuous possession of the exhibitor by this deadline.** Registration papers must be submitted within 30 days of the possession deadline.)

November 10, 2025: Beef, Sheep, Goat, Dairy Breeding, and Exhibition Poultry.

November 17, 2025: Miniature Cattle

December 1, 2025: Swine Breeding

December 1, 2025: Exhibition Rabbits

January 21, 2026: Meat Pen Rabbits (state)

VALIDATION/KIT PICK UP AND DUE DATES

All animals can be validated by the exhibitor or parent on their own premise. The responsibility of tagging and collecting DNA hair samples will be that of the exhibitor and/or parent. Exhibitors should request a validation kit from the extension office. The validation will consist of ear tagging, pulling a hair sample & placing it in the envelope provided. Validation envelopes must be returned to the 4-H Office with the \$7 fee by the deadline stated below. Checks can be made out to Acadia 4-H Foundation or paid online at Acadia 4H Foundation website.

Animals validated must be in the exhibitor’s name or family name. Animals tagged for the 2025 LA State Fair may utilize the State Fair tag but must still pull hair to complete the LSU AgCenter State Show validations.

Animals participating in both the State Fair of Louisiana and the Spring LSU AgCenter shows must be validated

All validation packets must be turned in by the dates below. Livestock validation packets can be requested from the office by calling (337-788-8821) or emailing (dpercle@agcenter.lsu.edu). Cost is \$7.00 per animal validated. No exceptions!!

You also have the option to bring your animals to the LSU AgCenter Office at 157 Cherokee Drive, Crowley, LA and have your animals tagged and validated by appointment. Please contact Dani Percle (dpercle@agcenter.lsu.edu) to schedule an appointment.

Please remember that you will also have to complete and turn in entries through Fair Entry in order to compete at parish or district shows.

MANDATORY QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAM

For the third year, I am excited to announce an update to the Livestock Ethics requirement for all exhibitors at LSU AgCenter livestock shows. The Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program is an annual, web-based training required for all livestock exhibitors at LSU AgCenter livestock shows. There is a \$12 annual charge for each exhibitor. The certification number, found on each exhibitor's certificate which can be downloaded upon completion, will be a required field in Fair Entry and cross checked with reports from YQCA. **Last year's certification number will not be valid for the 2026 livestock show season.** The course can be found at www.yqcaprogram.org

FAQ's:

How often does an exhibitor have to complete a course? Since the curriculum is different each year, each exhibitor must complete their appropriate age course annually.

Is the program specie specific? No, the program is not species specific. General knowledge that covers all species is included in each annual course.

How will agents know if their students have completed their course? I will periodically receive a list from YQCA in order to cross check with Fair Entry. Upon request, I can share your most updated parish list of completions.

What will the exhibitors be learning each year in their web-based course? I have attached a Curriculum Map for your reference.

Is the course smart phone compatible? Yes, the course is easily accessible on a smart phone. Upon completion of the course on a smart phone, each participant will have the option to save the downloaded PDF to their photos, files, or other applications on their phone.

Approximately how long will it take the exhibitor to complete? Ideally, each course is designed to be completed within one hour. Exhibitors can login and out as needed to complete the course in multiple settings.

Why is there an annual \$12 fee for the web-based program? The fee structure was established by the YQCA Board of Directors with the goal of covering the cost of the program as a not-for-profit establishment. \$0.36 = credit card fees (typically); \$5.00 = technical/user support, email and phone support, based in U.S.; \$5.00 = online system hosting, maintenance, ongoing development, security and privacy assurance; \$1.64 = stays with YQCA to invest in ongoing curriculum development and revision, program management, and promotion

FARM VISITS

The 4-H livestock program plays a vital role in helping youth develop responsibility, confidence, and leadership through hands-on animal care and exhibition. As 4-H agents our goal is to support families and exhibitors through the livestock project the best we can. Farm visits are meant to be supportive and educational, not evaluative. They provide a great opportunity for exhibitors to ask questions and receive personalized feedback.

A **home visit** allows the 4-H agent to:

- Observe the livestock project in its home environment
- Engage in conversation with the exhibitor about their goals and progress
- Offer guidance or suggestions for improvement when needed
- Connect families with additional resources, including the state 4-H livestock specialist if necessary

NEW Acadia Parish Premier Exhibitor Contest

The Premier Exhibitor Program is designed to place emphasis and recognition on the exhibitor's knowledge and skills in 4-H and National FFA Organization livestock projects. The program provides additional awards and recognition to all exhibitors at the LSU AgCenter Livestock Show. The premier exhibitor contest is optional to participate in, but you must exhibit the species you wish to compete in.

The Parish Premier Exhibitor Contest will be held Monday January 5, 2026, at the 4-H Office from 1:00 p.m.- 4:30 p.m. (Pending registration numbers)

- All exhibitors interested in participating in the Acadia Parish premier exhibitor contest must register through 4-H Online under their events tab, by December 12, 2025.
- Only senior level exhibitors are eligible to compete (Grades 9-12).
- Premier Exhibitor Programs are available for beef, dairy, poultry, sheep, swine and goats. An exhibitor may compete in one or more Premier Exhibitor Programs provided they exhibit a qualified animal at the Acadia Parish Livestock Show.
- A cash prize will be presented to the top three exhibitors in each species. Placings will be announced during each species show (see show schedule)
- Resource lists can be found on the LSU AgCenter Website, under Premier Exhibitor species handouts, or you can contact the 4-H Office (337) 788-8821 to check-out copies of study materials.

POULTRY EXHIBITORS

4HONLINE

New steps to entering Poultry in 4hOnline:

1. After logging in and clicking add an animal, The next pop-up will ask you to enter an animal type and identifier. Under Animal Type you will select one of three poultry options from the dropdown menu:

1. Poultry – Bantam Exhibition
2. Poultry – Pen of Broilers
3. Poultry – Standard Exhibition

After selecting the desired Animal Type, enter into the tag field:

- For Broilers – Cockerel or Pullet
- For Exhibition – Breed and Sex (Ex.: Sicilian Buttercup Pullet)

Then Click Continue.

2. Broilers & Exhibition Poultry
 - a. Broilers
 - i. When entering in a Pen of Broilers, the next page will ask for Animal Gender. Enter "Female" for Pullets or "Male" for Cockerels.
 - ii. Leave the Tag field as "Pending"
 - iii. Note: You do not need to enter 3 separate birds into the system when entering Broilers. Entering once counts as a pen of three.
 - iv. After clicking the "Next" button, you can skip down to Step 4
 - b. Exhibition
 - i. On the next page it will ask for Breed, Animal Gender, Tag, and Type of Poultry (ducks included).
 - ii. Under Breed, select the correct breed from the dropdown menu provided.
 - iii. Note: The Dropdown menu lists them according to Class, Variety, and Breed as listed in the State Livestock Show Poultry Rules Section of the catalog.
 - iv. For Animal Gender, Select Male for cock/cockerel, or Female for a hen/pullet.

- v. The Tag field should still have "Pending" entered into it.
 - vi. Under Type of Poultry, you will type in COCK, COCKEREL, HEN, OR PULLET respective to the bird being entered.
 - vii. After checking to make sure you have entered everything correctly, Click "Next" at the bottom of the page.
3. Exhibition Poultry
 - a. The next page will ask for a photo of the chicken. This will need to be a side profile (left or right side) photo of the bird.
 - b. Click Upload and follow the prompts to upload your photo to the page.
 - c. After uploading your photo to the site, click "Next" at the bottom of the page.
 4. On the next page you'll review the information you entered in, make sure it's correct, then click "Submit"

EXHIBITION

All exhibition poultry must be blood tested to be eligible to show. On January 5, 2026 (tentative) from 9-11 a.m. at the Acadia Parish Extension Office, we will again offer exhibitors the option to get their blood test for their exhibition poultry (by appointment only). Please call or email Mary Beth Fleming (mleonards@agcenter.lsu.edu) by December 12th to set up your appointment. If you cannot make this date, you must get a state vet to blood test your birds.

An entry fee for the state livestock show will be due at the time of entry. **State entries will be submitted online through Fair Entry. The link will be posted online once available.**

BROILER

We will again have a parish and state broiler show. The birds for parish and state will come in at different times, so be careful that you order the right ones. Order forms can be found on the Acadia 4-H Livestock Page (<https://tinyurl.com/AcadiaPLivestock>) or you can pick one up from our office. You are not required to show at both shows. The LSU and Acadia Parish Junior Broiler Show chicks will be Straight Run and cost \$0.55 a chick for parish and \$0.75 a chick for state. Exhibitors will be allowed to show one pen of pullets and/or one pen of cockerels at each show. An entry must consist of three (3) broilers (either three pullets or three cockerels). Parish and State broiler orders are due by November 6, 2025. Parish Broilers delivery will be December 4th and state broilers on January 8th. An email will be sent out with the pickup times when available.

ACADIA PARISH JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW ENTRY PROCESS & FEES

All entries will be complete through the Fair Entry online system. **All exhibitors must complete their online entries by December 9, 2025.** Parish entries will open on November 1, 2025. There will be a separate entry link for parish and district shows. Please use the corresponding links below.

- All applications for entry must be made through the Fair Entry online system. Youth will be able to select which animals they would like to enter in 4-H and/or FFA. Phone entries WILL NOT be accepted.
- **Fees are: \$30.00 per exhibitor for all species. \$40.00 Late Fee will be added to the fees for entries turned in between December 6-9th.** No entries will be accepted after December 9, 2025.
- Make checks payable to: Acadia Parish 4-H Foundation **Due December 9, 2025.** Validation nor 4-H Online animal submissions do not serve as an entry. All exhibitors must fill out their entry for their species for both parish and district at the links below.

 - **For Market swine exhibitors, be sure to put your animals in the class that corresponds with the divisions (AOB, Duroc, Yorkshire, Hampshire, Cross Gilt, Barrow) when completing your parish entries. This will be classified at parish show.**

BREED SHOWS

Market Hogs

Market Hogs at District shows, and the LSU Jr. Livestock Show will continue to show by breeds. The Breed classes are Duroc, Berkshire, York, Hamp, Cross Gilt and Barrow Division. Exhibitors will be allowed to show barrows in the Barrow Division against other barrows, or they may show them in the Market Hog Breed Divisions if they classify Hampshire, Duroc, Yorkshire or AOB. If you show your barrow in the Market

Hog Breed Divisions at District and they are classified out of the Breed Division at State, your barrow will show in the Barrow Division. If you show your barrow in the Barrow Division at District, then you will also show it in the Barrow Division at State.

The Acadia Parish Swine show will be shown by breed divisions again this year. The breed divisions are as follows; AOB (Berkshires, Chester Whites, Poland China, Spots, Herefords), Duroc, Yorkshire, Hampshire, Gross Gilt, and Barrow divisions. All Market Swine showing in a breed division will need to be classified at weigh in to qualify to show in that division. Exhibitors will be allowed to show cross gilts/ barrows in those respective divisions, or they may show them in a breed division if they classify at the show. (times for classification will be in the parish show schedule) If a breed division does not have at least 5 entries the breed division will default to AOB.

Market Steers

2026 LSU AgCenter State Livestock Show – Market Steer Division

Exhibitors will be allowed to exhibit up to 3 Market Steers. Exhibitors may Enter/Exhibit three (3) steers in the Market Steer Show, three (3) steers in the Pilot BRAHMAN INFLUENCE Show, or a combination of steers in both shows not to exceed Three (3) Steers per exhibitor.

2026 LSU AgCenter Market Steer Show:

As recommended and approved through our last advisory process the 2026 Market Steer show will show by weight only. Steers will have no slick requirement and fitting of Hair will be allowed as outlined in our Show catalog.

We will be piloting a NEW show at our 2026 LSU AgCenter State Livestock Show that will feature BRAHMAN INFLUENCED steers.

2026 Brahman Influence Steer Show (SLICK):

This Show is designed for Steers with a minimum of 25% Brahman influence in their genetic makeup. Our goal is to use DNA for validation as well as classification. (We are still considering providers to get the validation/classification processed finalized but it is our intent to use DNA classification once the process is vetted properly and a provider is selected.) The status of the classification will be known early in the process and can be confirmed shortly after DNA is submitted. Therefore, once steers are classified as Brahman Influence it will be final, and no reclassification would be required at Districts or State Show.

The 2026 Brahman Influence steer show will be a Slick Steer Show; all steers will be required to be slick Sheered as per guidelines listed in catalog. (Final hair length will be determined through the 2025 Advisory process beef committee meeting.)

Market Lambs

Market Lambs will continue to be shown by breed at all the District Shows and the LSU Jr. Livestock Show. The Breed Shows are as follows: Hampshire, Suffolk, Natural Color, Black Face AOB/Crosses and White Face AOB/Crosses. The Parish market lamb show will continue to show by weight.

PARISH PARKING AND CAMPER SPOTS

Call the Acadia Parish Rice Arena for camper spot reservations. All reservations must be made in advance and are distributed on a first book first serve basis. Reservations can be made by calling 337-384-4500.

Parking—Trailers can be parked where they will be putting new gravel.

- No trailers or trucks attached to trailers in the parking lot
- Trailers can park in grass and by the warmup arena
- Trailers and trucks should be entirely in the grass, not hanging out in the parking lot

SCHOLARSHIPS

Parish Scholarships

The Acadia Parish Livestock Committee will be awarding \$1,200 (Unless additional donations are given) in scholarship funds to a 4-H or FFA member. The scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior who is a bonafide 4-H or FFA member and shows livestock at the 2026 Acadia Parish Livestock Show. The youth must complete an application and go through an interview. Applications can be found at the 4-H Office. Applications are due January 5, 2026, at 4:30pm. Interviews will tentatively be held January 8th at 3:30 p.m. Scholarship forms can be picked from the office or found on our parish livestock website. <https://tinyurl.com/AcadiaPLivestock>

SW District Scholarships

The SW District Livestock show offers several scholarship opportunities.

The J. C. Barman Memorial scholarship is for beef exhibitors and is due Saturday, January 31, 2026, in the Barn Office at the Burton Complex.

The W.T. Burton Scholarship is awarded to the exhibitor who receives the most points calculated by their district placings. This scholarship is due Saturday, January 31, 2026, in the Barn Office at Burton Complex.

The Participation Scholarship is available to graduating seniors. This form is due Monday, January 19, 2026, to the Calcasieu LSU AgCenter Extension Office. Applicants then complete an essay on Thursday, January 29, 2026, and the finalists are interviewed on Saturday, January 31, 2026.

LIVESTOCK SALE

If the weather permits, the sale will be held in the livestock barn. The agents along with the livestock advisory board reserve the right to move the sale to the 4-H office if they so choose.

- All youth participating in the livestock sale **MUST** wear proper attire (show attire) for the livestock sale. You are representing our whole parish when you sale, please be sure to dress in a showmanship worthy outfit. **Agent has the right to pull you from the sale if you are not dressed appropriately.**
- Exhibitors will be allowed to sell only one steer or one lamb or one goat or one hog or one meat pen or one broiler pen. If an exhibitor has more than 1 champion, the exhibitor may choose to sale up to 2 champion animals (Overall Grand and Reserve Champions only).
- The Livestock Show Committee reserves the right to make exceptions they deem necessary to the sale rules on a case-by-case basis.
- All market animals will be placed in numerical order according to class placing. Exhibitors having more than one animal will not be allowed to switch animals in sale after the sale order is published.
- **SALE OF ANIMAL.** The animal purchased in the sale must be the same animal delivered to the buyer or slaughterhouse. No replacement animals are allowed.
- **Any exhibitor with an overall grand or reserve animal is required to present his/her animal in the sale.**
- All exhibitors who wish to sell their animal in the parish livestock sale must exhibit their own animal in the sale. If circumstances occur and the exhibitor cannot be in the sale, a parish **sale hardship form must be filled out by 5pm on the Friday** before the sale and hardship must be approved. If an exhibitor is not present to sell their animal without an approved hardship, their lot will be moved to the back of the sale in order to give them time to arrive. If the exhibitor does not make it in time to sell their own animal, the lot will be scratched from the sale.
- Purchases of animals will be billed to buyers following the show and sale. A 3% charge on all animals sold in the sale will be deducted from each check to assist in defraying expenses for the Parish Show and Sale.
- There will be no resale of animals. If you wish to resale an animal, you must make arrangements with the selected slaughterhouse.
- Animals sold in the Acadia Parish Junior Livestock Sale remain the property and responsibility of the exhibitors until delivered to the buyer or slaughterhouse. Exhibitors are required to feed and care for all market animals sold at the parish sale for a minimum of 7 days after the last show it was exhibited. Animals can be delivered to the slaughterhouse at any time after the 7-day withholding period upon the buyer's request.
- All red and white ribbon market animals will not be offered for sale. Animals not meeting minimum weight requirements are not eligible for sale.

MARKET SALE SLIPS

Market Sale Slips to sell market animals in the parish sale must be turned in a market sale slip by 3:00p.m. on the day of that species show.

PARADE OF CHAMPIONS

There will be a parade of champions for all champion animal exhibitors (breeding and market) held before the livestock sale. All champions will receive their awards during the show but are asked to be present Saturday morning for the Parade of Champions.

THANK YOU, LETTERS,

Every exhibitor who sold their project in the Livestock Sale will be required to write a letter of appreciation to the purchaser of the project. Proof of the appreciation letter along with a stamped addressed envelope must be submitted to the 4-H Office prior to release of the auction payment to the exhibitor. **The County Agent should receive the appreciation letter no later than March 3rd.** Any exhibitor, who has not

submitted proof of their Thank-You Letter to the supervising County Agent by this date, may forfeit his/her proceeds. The proceeds will be sent back to the buyer or donated to the livestock fund

DISBURSEMENT OF MONEY

Every effort will be made to pay the Auction payments as soon as possible; however, payment cannot be guaranteed until the buyers remit payment to the 4-H Office. **Sale checks will be issued beginning in April.** Checks will not be mailed; they must be picked up at the 4-H Office by June 16 or money will be turned over to the state.

ACADIA PARISH LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES

January 15-17, 2026

GENERAL

- LSU Livestock Show rules will be enforced at the parish show.
- The Acadia Parish Livestock Show reserves to the Livestock Advisory Board the final absolute rights to interpret, amend and add to the rules and regulations.
- The superintendents, Dani Percle and Kayla Segura have final authority and responsibility for interpretation and enforcement of rules during judging of the show.
- Open to bonafide 4-H and FFA members.
- **FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENTS.** Non-United States Citizens and Foreign Exchange Students are eligible to compete in the Livestock Shows provided they meet all eligibility requirements.
- In no case shall the livestock show or any of its personnel be held responsible for any loss, damage or death, by disease or otherwise, to any person, property or exhibit while in route to, from or on exhibit grounds.
- The Livestock Show also reserves the right to drug test any market animal participating in the parish show.
- District and State Show Rules with respect to entries, will apply to the parish show. LSU rules regarding possession dates will be adhered to and no animals may be purchased or replaced after possession date unless approved by the Livestock Show Committee through the hardship process.
- Exhibitors must show their own animal(s) in both the show ring and sale.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

- The Officials of the Acadia Parish Livestock Show are dedicated to the promotion of high standards of competition, sportsmanship, ethics and fair play. Each exhibitor is expected to strictly follow these rules and to conduct himself or herself in a manner that will reflect respect upon the exhibitor, his or her school, organization, and parents. Any exhibitor or member of his/her family who violates and misrepresents Acadia Parish by misconduct or rule infraction at the Parish, District or State Livestock shows may have parish sale and other awards canceled.
- Exhibitors may be disqualified for any of the following:
 - **Possession or use of illegal drugs and/or alcoholic beverages**
 - Misuse or abuse of personal property (or facilities)
 - Disrespect for the authority of agents, Ag. Teachers or leaders
 - Disruptive or abusive behavior of exhibitors or family members to other participants or spectators.
 - Failure to comply with all COVID-19 guidelines outlined by the LSU AgCenter
- **No alcoholic beverages will be allowed in the barn or on show premises.**
- No heat lamps allowed. No open flame cookers, No BBQ pits allowed in the barn area. No butane bottles in the pen or tie areas. The barn is a smoke-free area. Locks on pens and stalls and use of automatic waterers are not allowed. Side fans only in beef.
- No roping dummies, scooters, hoover boards, bikes, or other riding toys allowed in the barns. No dogs are allowed on show grounds except service dogs.
- Exhibitors and guardians are required to keep their animals and exhibit area clean at all times. Manure and other refuse are to be placed in the dumpster located on the East side of the barn during the parish show and never in the trash receptacles in the barn.
- No one will be allowed in the judging ring other than the judge, contestants and superintendents except in an emergency. This also includes the rabbit and poultry shows.
- No animals will be allowed to leave the show premises until the designated release time.

AWARDS

- Judges shall place classes according to the Schedule of Awards listed:
 - PREMIUMS
 - No premiums will be paid on any animal.
 - BELT BUCKLES
 - Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship Champions
 - Overall, Champions
 - Banners (tentative)
 - Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Reserve Champions
 - Banners (tentative)
 - Champion and Reserve Champion Breeding Animals
 - ROSETTES/BANNERS/PLAQUES (tentative)
 - Division Champions
 - Best of Opposite Breed Rabbits
 - Louisiana Bred Champions
 - RIBBONS
 - Exhibitors will receive purple, blue, red or white placings.
 - Top five showmanship/class winners.
 - There are some exceptions to this due to sponsored awards.
- Only purple ribbon animals will be considered in Champion and Reserve Champion or Best of Breed and Best Opposite Sex of Breed Classes. This includes Louisiana Bred Champions. A market animal must be properly tagged and entered as LA Bred in order to qualify for the Louisiana Bred Champion awards. Division Champion and Reserve Division Champion animals will be selected in the market lamb and hog shows. Only these animals will compete for overall Champion, Reserve Champion, Louisiana Bred Champion and Louisiana Bred Reserve Champion Awards.

ANIMAL HEALTH/BIOSECURITY

- Storage of tack, feed and hay should be done in accordance with State Show rules.
- Health certificates are required on all animals to be exhibited. Each exhibitor is responsible for getting health papers on their animals before the show. Exhibition poultry must be tested prior to parish show by a veterinarian and health papers issued for those birds testing negative for pullorum/typhoid and Avian Influenza. Parents and exhibitors are responsible for obtaining health certificates for all other health requirements including brucellosis testing and vaccinations. No swine will be unloaded onto show premises unless proper health certificates are presented to the official in charge. *Health certificates issued must be valid through the State Livestock Show.
- Pen space for all animal species participating in parish show will be acquired by exhibitors on a first come basis. Assigned beef, hog, and sheep pen/tie spaces will be issued for district and state shows.
- Absolutely NO drenching of livestock will be allowed.
- The Livestock Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify any animals that have been unethically fitted or is ineligible by reason of age for exhibition in class entered. See Livestock Show Catalogue Book.
- Any mistreatment of animals will be considered grounds for disqualification. Exhibitors must use commercially prepared muzzles.

SHOW SCHEDULE

- All animals must remain in barn until after the conclusion of the sale** (with the exception of rabbits and poultry). If any animals leave the barn prior to the conclusion of the sale, there will be consequences for the exhibitor/family. First time offenders will not be eligible to compete as a champion at the parish show the following year, second time offenders will not be eligible to participate in the parish show the following year.

BREEDING ANIMALS

- Only registered breeding animals that have been properly transferred in the name of the junior exhibitor by that species' possession date will be allowed to show in their respective classes. No member will be allowed to show more than one breeding animal in each age class.
- Breeding Animals: If a breed not recognized by LSU has 5 or more entries, they will show as a separate breed. Breeds with less than 5 head will go into their perspective All Other Breeds class.

MARKET AND COMMERCIAL ANIMALS

- All animals shown at the Parish Show are required to be validated by tag by the possession date for each species. If any animals are not tagged on these dates, they will be ineligible to show.
- Animals not exhibiting a Louisiana Bred ear tag in their ear upon entry deadline will not be eligible to compete as Louisiana Bred. Swine exhibitors must have Louisiana Bred certificate in possession to compete for Louisiana Bred.
- Scrapie Tags. Sheep and Goat Exhibitors. The state law and our show rules dictate that an official scrapie tag must be in the ear of all sheep and goats shown in Louisiana. You must obtain your scrapie tags from the person for whom you bought them from.
- Minimum and maximum market animal weight limitations are listed for each show.

- All market animals will be weighed prior to judging. All animals must be stripped of all covers. Animals will be weighed only once. If the weight of a market animal is questioned, reweighing must be done before leaving the official scale area. Once weights are turned in; they are not subject to be changed.
- Commercial gilts will be shown by weight. Official weigh in with no weigh back.

RABBITS

1. Rabbits will be entered by breed, sex, and age. They are classified as Junior, Intermediate or Senior animals by show officials. Breeds recognized by the ARBA and crossbred rabbits are eligible to be exhibited. Exhibitors may show three breeders per class.
2. Meat pen rabbits shall consist of 3 rabbits not over 70 days of age with each rabbit not less than 3 pounds and not over 5 pounds. Shall consist of the same breed and variety/color. All recognized meat type breeds will be accepted (excluding lops). Each exhibitor must show their own pen; one assistant will be allowed at the show table. No adults will be accepted as assistants.

DAIRY

1. All registered dairy animals older than 6 months of age must be dehorned or be naturally polled. Horn scurs are allowed. All Commercial dairy animals weighing more than 350 lb must be dehorned or be naturally polled. Horn scurs are allowed.
2. Dry cow class for each breed of registered dairy animals: to qualify the cow must be dry (not lactating) and must have freshen (calved) at least once.

Entry fees are \$10 for entry except rabbits and poultry which are \$5/entry. **Entries will be completed online at Fair Entry for District. All large livestock animals and poultry entries along with payment must be completed by December 15th**

DISTRICT RABBIT EXHIBITORS

Online entries for the district show are due January 10, 2026.

Rabbit breeding show. Will follow ARBA rules unless otherwise stated below.

- A. Possession date for all breeding rabbits is December 1 each year. Rabbits must be in exhibitors care and possession.
- B. All Entries must be filled out with parish offices by their deadline.
- C. Entry fee will be \$5 per rabbit.
- D. All Rabbits must be tattooed with permanent and legible identification. Tattoo must be in left ear. If you do not have access to tattoo supplies. Please contact your 4-H office for help. They should have a volunteer in their parish to assist with tattooing your rabbits.
- E. Crossbred rabbits will be allowed to show.
- F. Rabbit showmanship will be offered. Study guides will be sent out to agents to distribute. No test will be given.
- G. Each age division will have a class. There will be a Junior Division champion from ages 13 and under and senior division champion from ages 14 and over.
- H. Will select Best of Breed and Best opposite of each breed. Overall, will select Best in show and Second best of show.

SHOWMANSHIP

To participate in showmanship for the District Show exhibitors must sign up when registering online through Fairent. Reminder Exhibitor MUST exhibit their own animal.

CALF SCRAMBLE-FORMS ARE DUE BACK NOTARIZED BY JAN 10TH

Southwest District Livestock Show Inc., McNeese State University, Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, Harper Morgan Rodeo Productions Inc., and the Cattlemen's Association in the Southwest District will be conducting a Calf Scramble Contest again this year. A calf scramble will be held at each rodeo performance, and the winner will receive \$1000 towards the purchase of a calf to show at next year's District Show.

Those interested must be a 4-H member or FFA member, must have access to reasonable facilities to keep and care for a calf, must meet academic standards for show participation, must be able to give some reasonable assurance that you are able to feed, groom, and care for a calf, must not be enrolled beyond the junior year in high school, must be in good physical condition, and without any evidence of recent injury, must show the calf at next year's District Livestock Show. 2026 SOUTHWEST DISTRICT JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The general rules that apply to the LSU Junior Show and the District Shows will be adhered to. Southwest District Livestock Show Management reserves the right to disqualify any animal(s) exhibited if an exhibitor is found, in the opinion of the show Management, in violation of the rules. Any violation of rules will be reported to the LSU Agricultural Livestock Show Management.

- A. No heat lamps allowed. No open-flame cookers and no BBQ pits are permitted in the barn area. No butane bottles in the pen or tie areas. The barn is a smoke-free area. Locks on pens and stalls, as well as the use of automatic waterers, are not allowed. Side fans only in the beef area. No scooters, hoverboards, or bikes are allowed in the barns.

No dogs are allowed on the showgrounds, except for service dogs.

- B. **EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT** - An exhibitor may be disqualified for any of the following:

- Possession of illegal drugs and/or alcohol
- Misuse or abuse of personal or facility property
- Disrespect of the authority of Agents, Ag Teachers, Leaders, or Superintendents
- Disruptive or abusive behavior by exhibitors or family members toward other participants or spectators

- C. Any superintendent, along with show management, will have the authority to disqualify individuals in violation of rules and enforce policies and procedures adopted by the Southwest District Livestock Show Advisory Committee.

- D. Weigh Procedure - All animals must make District minimum weight to qualify for LSU. Exhibitors, parents, agents, or FFA Advisors are responsible for weighing animals prior to the deadline for each species. Only one entry weight on a properly signed weigh card will be accepted. Market hogs will be “weigh your own” and will have a mandatory weigh-back. Market steers, lambs, and goats will not have a re-weigh and will use the official weight given by the weighmaster at the scales.

- B. **ONCE WEIGHT CARDS ARE TURNED IN, THEY ARE NOT SUBJECT TO CHANGE**

- C. Classifying:
Market Swine, Commercial Heifers, and Market Lambs **must be declared on entry form by the exhibitor and will be reviewed and can be reclassified at District.**

- D. In order to compete for Class Champion or Reserve, or La. Bred Class Champion or Reserve Market Animal, animals must be re-weighed and meet the following tolerances of their show weight:

Once an animal leaves the weigh area, they cannot be re-weighed. If an exhibitor disagrees with the initial weight, they must ask for a re-weigh immediately.

- E. **IMPORTANT!** Lightweight market hogs will have their minimum weight verified prior to showing in class. If an individual does not meet the minimum weight, they will not be allowed to show and will not be eligible for the LSU Jr. Show as per the LSU Rule.

All market steers will have their minimum weight verified during weigh-in. If a steer does not meet the minimum weight, **it will not show in class** and will not be eligible for the LSU Jr. Show.

- F. Market animals will be shown by weights, starting with lightweight classes.

5. Rabbit Breeding Show: Will follow ARBA rules unless otherwise stated below.

- A. Possession date for all breeding rabbits is December 1 each year. Rabbits must be in the exhibitors' care and possession.
- B. All Entries must be filled out by parish offices by their deadline.
- C. The entry fee will be \$5 per rabbit.
- D. All rabbits must be tattooed with permanent and legible identification. The tattoo must be on the left ear. If you do not have access to tattoo supplies. Please contact your 4-H office for help. They should have a volunteer in their parish to assist with tattooing your rabbits.
- E. Crossbred rabbits will be allowed to show.
- F. Rabbit showmanship will be offered. Study guides will be sent out to agents to distribute. No test will be given.
- G. Each age division will have a class. There will be a Junior Division Champion from ages 13 and under and a Senior Division Champion from ages 14 and over.
- H. Will select Best of Breed and Best Opposite of each breed. Overall, will select Best in Show and Second Best of Show.

6. Exhibition Poultry Show:

- A. Poultry entry fees will be \$5.00 per bird.
- B. General rules and guidelines for the show will come from the State Poultry Show catalog with the exception of the number of birds an exhibitor may enter on the District Level. The District Show is not a qualifying event for an exhibitor's birds to advance to the State Show.
- C. Each exhibitor may only enter a **total of six exhibition birds**. An exhibitor may exhibit a maximum of three varieties of poultry; however, they can be any combination of standards or bantams. Within each variety, an exhibitor may enter no more than two cocks, two cockerels, two hens, and two pullets.
- D. At check-in, exhibitors must present a valid Health Certificate from a general veterinarian as well as a VS Form 9-2 from a state veterinarian indicating that the bird(s) have been tested and are free of *Salmonella pullorum* and *Salmonella gallinarum* (pullorum and typhoid). You may contact your 4-H Agent for more information.
- E. Exhibition Poultry will be shown by Variety/Breed and Class, following the LSU Livestock Show Catalog Poultry Rules. Within each breed, birds will be awarded a Quality Group Ribbon, with Purple representing top quality, then Blue, Red, and White in that order. The top three birds in each breed will be awarded 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place, and that placing will be noted on the back of the Quality Ribbon (Purple Ribbon). Only birds in the Purple Quality Group will be eligible for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places. 1st Place within each breed will receive an Award Medallion.
All of the 1st Place winners within each breed will be judged to determine the Champion and Reserve Champion within each Class (i.e., American, English, Mediterranean, Continental, Asiatic, and Any Other Standard Breed; Modern Game, Old English Game, SCCL, RCCL, AOCCL, and Feather Legged). Class Champions and Reserve Class Champions will receive a Rosette. The Class Champions will be judged to select a Champion Bantam and Champion Standard. These two winners will receive a trophy (or buckle if funds allow).
- F. Showmanship is optional, and divisions will include Junior (9 - 13-year-olds) and Senior (14 and older). Ribbons will be awarded in all classes, and buckles will be awarded to the division Champions.

G. All entries must be leg-banded for identification purposes.

7. An exhibitor can show 3 market steers, 3 market hogs, 3 market goats, 3 market lambs, 3 commercial heifers, 3 commercial dairy, 3 commercial does, 2 commercial ewes, and 3 commercial gilts at the District Show. Breeding requirements: a club or chapter member may enter as many registered animals as he desires; however, no member will be allowed to show no more than one per class except for dairy heifers that calf and are moved to the two-year-old class. They can be shown with another two-year-old by the same exhibitor.
8. All animals will be placed according to the Danish system. (Purple, Blue, Red, White) and ribbons awarded accordingly. Market Steer, Lamb, and Hog divisions will select division Champions and Reserve Champions, and they will return to compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the Show. Any animal must be purple ribbon quality in order to receive a Champion or Reserve Champion Award.
9. Belt Buckles, Trophies, and/or Banners will be presented to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champions.
10. All certified La. Bred Animals certified prior to placing in the purple, blue, or red ribbon groups are eligible to receive premium money. Breeding animals placing purple, or blue will also be eligible for premiums.
11. Showmanship classes will start with the oldest and end with the youngest. Those who were 14 or older on or before December 31 will compete as seniors. ***Showmanship entries will be taken online for the district shows.**
12. **All Entry fees are due at the same time entries are due. No paying for entries at check-in.**
13. No one will be allowed to sleep in the barn with the animals.
14. Rules for operation of the Burton Coliseum Complex, as set down by the Calcasieu Parish Police Jury, will be strictly adhered to.
15. Parents or Legal Guardians will be responsible for the behavior of their children at all times.
16. All Exhibitors are subject to the supervision of all Agents and Vo Ag Teachers on the livestock grounds.
17. Superintendents and Extension Office Secretaries will check registration papers or copies of all breeding animals.
18. Breeding sheep must be shown **SLICK SHEARED** (except recognized wool breeds) with no wool above the knees or hocks.
19. No straw or hay will be allowed in the barn as bedding. No hay can be fed in beef or dairy ties except in hay nets.
20. Health papers are required on all animals exhibited at the District Show. Papers must be checked by LDAF before unloading.
21. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. The protest must be filed with the Livestock Show Manager immediately upon the occasion for such protest and must contain at least one specific charge stating all facts relied upon or the rules violated, and name witnesses and their addresses. No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent or have overlooked an animal will be considered.
22. Any protests will be resolved by the Show Manager, Superintendent, Agent, or Ag Teacher involved. Anyone who leaves early with their animal from the District Show without proper release forfeits all awards and may not be allowed to show at the LSU State Junior Show.

SW DISTRICT LIVESTOCK SHOW | UNLOADING INSTRUCTIONS

1. **All trailers must enter the lot by Gauthier Road (North Entrance)** and have health papers checked in the Northwest lot.
2. Beef and Swine trailers will enter the barn lot by the Northwest gate (closest to the Coliseum) and exit by the Southwest gate. **No trailers will be allowed in the barn.**

3. Sheep and goats will be unloaded on the North side of the outdoor arena. Sheep will be housed on the east side of the barn and goats on the west side. **No trailers are allowed in the barn.**
4. After unloading, all trailers must be taken home or to the McNeese football field for parking. **Trailers left in the lot overnight will be subject to towing.**
5. Poultry will use the SW Gate entrance, drive to the barn to park/unload, and then check health papers.
6. Rabbits will use the North side of the Outdoor Arena to park/unload and then enter through the West side of the Arena to check health papers.
