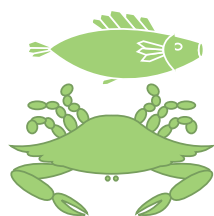

# Agriculture: Backbone of Louisiana's Economy

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This publication tabulates the value of Louisiana agriculture in 2023. Agents and specialists of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, as well as other agencies – both private and public – compiled the data. Their analysis focuses on the animal, forestry, fisheries, plant and wildlife commodities that comprise our vital agricultural industry. Agricultural and natural resource industries contribute significantly to our state's economy with the potential for increased economic benefits and job creation through value-added processing in urban and rural communities throughout Louisiana.

Each production year has its own set of unique circumstances that help to shape and characterize the year. This was certainly the case this year as drought conditions and excessive heat will be what is most remembered about the 2023 production year. After coming off the 2022 production year that was characterized by historically high input costs and excessive rainfall during much of the harvest season, there was guarded optimism and hope for improved growing conditions and profitability in 2023. Input prices, while still historically high, moderated from the 2022 levels and commodity prices, while down from historically high levels in 2022, were still projected at generally favorable levels. Unfortunately, this optimism quickly changed to concern as drought conditions began to materialize in late spring and persisted throughout the summer and into the fall. Coupled with the drought conditions was excessive heat that added to production challenges. Weather data shows that rainfall totals from May 2023 to October 2023 ranged from 6% to 66% below normal levels, depending on location. Similarly, average daytime high temperatures from May to October ranged from 0.5 to 4.1 F higher than normal levels, again depending on location. The combined stresses caused by the lack of moisture and extreme temperatures had significant impacts on agricultural production in most locations around the state.

In response to the adverse weather conditions, the LSU AgCenter conducted a damage assessment survey and calculated that the economic impact of the drought and excessive heat was over \$1.6 billion. While certainly a significant impact to the state's food and fiber sectors, the full magnitude of those estimated impacts will not be fully represented in the values reported in this publication for a couple of reasons. First, this publication only estimates production and gross revenue from agricultural production. Much of the \$1.6 billion estimated impact was associated with increased production costs (increased irrigation costs, increased feeding costs, etc.) which are not represented by the values in this publication. Second, a significant portion of the economic impact to the livestock sector was related to forced liquidations. Forced liquidations, while significant for the long-run sustainability of the livestock operation, show up as increased animal sales in this publication. As such, the gross revenue generated by the livestock sector in 2023 will be, for many species, higher than in previous years. And finally, given the weather difficulties experienced in 2022 and its impact on yields, comparing yields reported in 2023 to those in 2022 may not fully illustrate the drought and heat impacts on 2023 production.

Comparing yields in 2023 for commodities like corn and irrigated cotton does not tell the story of the difficult production conditions in 2023. For both commodities, yields in 2023 were reported at slightly higher levels than 2022. However, when 2023 yields are compared to five-year averages, corn yields in 2023 were roughly 8 bushels an acre lower while irrigated cotton yields were nearly 140 pounds of lint lower. For other commodities like soybeans, hay, nonirrigated cotton, grain sorghum and wheat, yields in 2023 were, in fact, lower than 2022 levels and also were significantly lower than five-year averages. Soybean yields in 2023 were roughly 11 bushels per acre below 2022 levels and nearly 20 bushels per acre below the five-year average. Hay yields were 0.8 tons below 2022 levels and more than 1 ton per acre lower than the five-year average. Nonirrigated cotton yields were nearly 200 pounds per acre lower than 2022 and over 300 pounds per acre lower than the five-year average. Grain sorghum yields were only 1 bushel per acre lower than in 2022 but were roughly 10 bushels per acre lower than the five-year average. And finally, wheat yields were roughly 4 bushels per acre lower than in 2022 and about 2 bushels per acre lower than the five-year average.

The reduction in production compared to the previous year and the five-year average was seen for many but not all commodities. Irrigated commodities, like rice, experienced an increase in yields from 2022 and from the five-year average. While there were significant quality issues for the rice crop in 2023 given the excessive heat, yields were strong and supported by extremely good second crop or ratoon yields across much of southwest Louisiana. And while there were some areas that were devastated by drought conditions, a large portion of the sugarcane growing region of the state received just enough rainfall to support yields. Strong yields in those areas offset the significantly reduced yields in the hardest hit areas resulting in a state average sugar yield that was over 400 pounds higher than the five-year average.

While it is more difficult to see the impacts of the drought and excessive heat on livestock enterprises from the data reported in this publication, 2023 was an extremely difficult year for all operations. Reduced forage and hay production led to forced liquidation, selling animals earlier than normal, and increased feed costs. For example, the percentage of calves sold at below 400 pounds was nearly 3 percentage points higher in 2023 than in 2022, indicating lower growth rates due to drought impacts and producers weaning and selling calves earlier than normal to reduce stress on cows and to preserve limited forage and feed supplies. Similarly, milk production was lower in 2023 as cow stress caused by excessive heat reduced productivity. Finally, for crawfish, the impacts of the adverse weather conditions in 2023 won't be felt until the 2024 production year. Increased mortality of crawfish seeded in 2023 for 2024 production due to drought and excessive heat will not be reflected until 2024 crawfish production values are reported.

As mentioned previously, there was much optimism and hope for improved profitability in 2023 based on expectations for lower input costs and, despite being lower than the previous year, strong commodity prices. And, for the most part, commodity prices did remain at levels that would have projected acceptable profitability levels at average or above average yields. Unfortunately, the impacts to production and quality from the drought placed considerable pressure on profitability. Again, while prices for major row crop plant enterprises were mostly down from the previous year, they were still well above five-year averages. The largest price reductions were seen for cotton, feed grains, and wheat with an average reduction of nearly 18% from the previous year. Soybean prices were also down in 2023 but at a much more moderate reduction of about 7%. Prices for rice, sugar and hay, however, experienced year over year increases. Rice prices were up nearly 10% on lower global supplies and improving global demand. Sugar prices continued the trend of year over year increases during the last several years and were up by over 11%. Hay prices were up by more than 14% as lower supplies caused by the drought pushed prices higher. Prices for other plant enterprises were mostly mixed. Prices for fruit crops and nursery enterprises were mostly higher in 2023 while prices for vegetable enterprises were mostly unchanged. Prices for pecans were lower in 2023 due to higher global supplies.

Prices for livestock enterprises were mixed for 2023. As with plant enterprises, several prices moderated from the high levels seen in 2022. Prices for milk, poultry, sheep, goats and swine were lower in 2023. Milk prices were down roughly 14% in 2023 while broiler prices and edible egg prices were both down more than 37% as prices moderated from the historically high prices in 2022. Prices for sheep, goats and swine, while down, didn't see as large a reduction with most prices across the different classes down around 10%. Beef cattle prices, however, were up across all classes in 2023 as lower cattle supplies and continued strong beef demand supported sharply higher prices. Beef cattle prices averaged nearly 35% higher than 2022 across all classes of cattle. And while milk prices were down, prices for dairy cattle were also higher with an average increase of over 30%.

Prices for fisheries and wildlife enterprises were, on average, up roughly 7% in 2023 versus the previous year. Enterprises that saw price improvements included farm raised alligators, oysters, soft-shell crabs, wild caught crawfish, freshwater finfish, fur animals and honey. These commodities saw prices increase from a low of roughly 7% (honey and farm raised alligators) to a high of 55% (fur animals). Enterprises that experienced a price decrease were farm raised crawfish, catfish, shrimp and crabs. Increased production and softer demand due to inflationary pressures saw crawfish prices fall about 17% in 2023 and was the lowest level seen since 2008. Catfish prices were roughly 4% lower primarily to higher global supplies. Crab prices were down roughly 5% while shrimp prices were down roughly 21%. In both cases, increased global competition and lower disposable consumer income resulting from inflationary pressures are believed to be primary causes.

While the overall farm gate value of the state's food and fiber sector decreased by 5.5% over the previous year due to drought and excessive heat impacts and lower commodity prices, 2023's farm gate value remains as one of the highest levels experienced over the last 20 years. For each of the three broad categories of enterprises (plant, livestock, and fisheries and wildlife), gross farm values decreased in 2023. The total gross farm value for all plant enterprises was down 3.7% from 2022. Despite large year-over-year increases for rice and feed grains, lower production and lower prices for most plant enterprises resulted in reductions in farm gate values from the previous year. Similarly, the total gross farm value for all animal enterprises was down roughly 12% from the previous year. Again, despite a significant increase in farm gate values for cattle and horses due to higher sale volumes and prices in 2023, lower prices resulted in declines for most other animal enterprises. The total gross farm value for fisheries and wildlife enterprises saw a much smaller decrease than the other sectors. Gross farm value was down by less than 1% in 2023 as increases for freshwater and marine fisheries and honey mostly offset declines seen in aquaculture and hunting leases.

When the commodities produced by agricultural producers are cleaned, processed, and packaged at the next stages of the marketing channel, these value-added activities create additional economic activity over and above that defined by the gross farm value. In 2023, these value-added activities were estimated to have an additional economic impact of \$5.5 billion. Taken together, the gross farm value and value-added activities were estimated to have a total economic impact of \$12.8 billion. This represents a nearly 8% decrease from 2022 but remains as the second largest level in the past 20 years. Given the level of economic activity that the state's agriculture, forestry and fishery industries continue to generate each year, it is undeniable that they continue to be major contributors to the overall state's economy. Cutting-edge research programs and extension education and outreach efforts of the LSU AgCenter remain critical to sustaining these economic benefits.

Many Louisiana communities depend on agriculture, forestry, fisheries and wildlife for local jobs and their economic well-being. However, for those who work in it day in and day out, agriculture, forestry and fisheries are far more than a business, a major job contributor and an economic engine. It truly is a way of life. Families have lived on many of these farms, forest lands or fishing villages for generations following a preferred way of life even though it means hard work, many hours, high risks and sometimes low incomes.

Each new production season has risks associated with commodity prices, trade agreements and higher input costs as well as uncertainty related to the weather. These conditions make the discovery and adoption of new agricultural technology developed by the LSU AgCenter more important than ever to our state's producers. Agriculture is a highly sophisticated segment of the national and world economy, becoming increasingly so every year. That is the reason we at the LSU AgCenter continue to support agriculture and consumers with factual information provided by a well-trained faculty of extension agents, specialists and research scientists.

Those of us in the LSU AgCenter, with its major branches of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service and the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, are proud to be part of Louisiana's agricultural industry, and we are committed to serving that industry and the citizens across the state of Louisiana in the years ahead.

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# Louisiana Summary

## Agricultural and Natural Resources 2023

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The statistical information in this summary was compiled from estimates made by extension agents of the LSU AgCenter after consulting with agricultural agency representatives, agricultural and agribusiness leaders, and others and after study of various reports and resource materials. State specialists with the LSU AgCenter checked parish-level data for specific commodities to ensure accuracy and consistency of all production information. Final review of data was conducted by LSU AgCenter agricultural economist and project director Kurt Guidry in consultation with external sources, including state and federal statistical agencies. Any inquiries about the data in this publication should be directed to Kurt Guidry in the LSU AgCenter's Department of Agricultural Economics who oversees the process of gathering all information for the Louisiana Summary.

Although this material is reasonably accurate and can be used for planning and other general informational purposes, this is not the official document of agricultural data for the state. Official statistical data are gathered, summarized and published by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service, Delta Regional Field Office, 10800 Financial Centre Parkway, Suite 110, Little Rock, Arkansas, 72211. Reproduction or publication of information in this summary should acknowledge the Louisiana Summary as the source but indicate the unofficial nature of the statistics.

Gross farm value was calculated for each commodity, which in some cases included a value from natural resources and consequently may not represent income to farmers. Gross farm values were calculated using calendar-year, market-weighted, state-level average prices, when available. When state-level price information was unavailable, price information was used from adjacent states (Texas, Arkansas or Mississippi) or the nation. Primary sources for prices were USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA Agricultural Marketing Service and USDA Economic Research Service. The gross farm value is an indicator of the commodity's contribution to economic activity in the state but is not an indicator of farm profits. Production costs greatly affect profit (or loss) for all commodities. Even when gross income increases over previous years, corresponding increases in production costs may decrease farm profits.

In the state summaries, the value added in cleaning, processing, packaging, marketing and transporting commodities is an estimate of the total contribution of agriculture and natural resources to the state's economy. The state summary may not be an exact summation of all parish reports as adjustments may occur due to changes in average prices received or to accommodate information from other sources. In each parish table only commodities that were of commercial economic value in that parish this year were listed. In some instances, the number of producers or the number of acres in a parish were not available. An asterisk was used to avoid releasing confidential information when too few producers were present for that commodity. Within some commodity groups, such as grains, fruits and commercial vegetables, the total number of producers has been omitted because some producers grow several different crops within the group. Adding together the producers of individual crops would not give a true total for the group.



# Animal Enterprises

Gross farm income for all animal enterprises was over \$1.8 billion for 2023, down 12% from \$2.1 billion in 2022. Value-added was over \$933.5 million for 2022, down from \$1.37 billion in 2022. Total value of all animal enterprises in the Louisiana economy was \$2.79 billion, down 19.8% from \$3.48 billion in 2022.

## Beef Cattle

Drought and extreme heat plagued Louisiana and other states throughout the south in 2023. This, coupled with elevated cattle prices, caused a reduction in herd size. Beef cow inventory numbers totaled an estimated 527,078 head, compared with 583,421 in 2022. Herd liquidations throughout the state resulted in the number of beef cattle producers dropping from 11,472 in 2022 to 10,950 in 2023. In review of Louisiana's beef cattle industry over recent years, consistent with the normal ten-year beef cattle cycle, the 2020 production year saw modest liquidation in beef cattle numbers were reflected throughout the country. Subsequently, the 2021 production year brought an increase in market prices, and herd size held steady within the state. 2022 then saw a slight rebuilding of herd size following stabilization in 2021.

Louisiana remains primarily a cow-calf state, with 70% of the 530,557 head of beef cattle marketed weighing less than 700 pounds. Increased market prices resulted in gross farm value increases across all classes of beef cattle. The gross farm value of 199,553 steer calves sold in 2023 was an estimated \$213.4 million, a decrease of approximately 13,706 head but an increase of \$45.8 million from the \$167.6 million reported in 2022. The estimated gross farm value of 170,764 heifers sold in 2023 was an estimated \$157.2 million, a decrease of approximately 14,849 head, but an increase of \$33.3 million from the \$123.9 million reported in 2022.

For 2023, 49,153 yearling cattle weighing 600 to 800 pounds per head sold for an estimated \$62.4 million. This was a decrease of 9,088 head, but an increase of \$8.2 million from the previous year. Increases were seen in the number of cow-calf pairs and cull cows marketed due to the previously mentioned drought and increase in prices. In 2023, 42,437 pairs sold for a gross value of \$55.7 million for an increase of 4,979 head and \$14.8 million from the previous year. Large increases were seen in the number of cull cows marketed and their gross value. For 2023, 61,995 head of cull cows sold, for a gross value of \$71.9 million. That is an increase of 13,102 head and a gross value increase of \$33.0 million compared to 2022. Cull bulls showed only slight changes in 2023 compared to 2022. In 2023, a total of 6,655 head of cull bulls sold for a gross value of \$8.4 million compared to 6,641 head selling for \$6.4 million in 2022.

All classes of beef cattle marketed had a total gross farm value of \$569 million in 2022. This was a staggering increase of \$137 million compared to 2022. Such a drastic increase is primarily due to both favorable market prices across all classes of cattle and the unfortunate downsizing of herds statewide due to the drought in 2023.

## Dairy

Milk production was reported by eight parishes in 2023. Three parishes in the southeastern part of the state accounted for over 88% of the herds, 90% of the cows and over 92% of the milk produced. The number of dairy farms decreased from 66 in 2022 to 60 in 2023. The number of milking cows decreased from 7,670 head in 2022 to 7,003 head in 2023. Total milk production decreased from 110.3 million pounds in 2022 to 101.2 million pounds in 2023. A reduction of over 9.1 million pounds of milk along with a 13.82% decrease in the price of milk lead to a decrease of over \$4.8 million in the gross farm value of milk.

The value of cull cows, bred heifers, mature cows, breeding age bulls and calves was roughly \$3.85 million. The total value of milk and animal sales to Louisiana dairy producers was \$25.9 million. Value added contributed nearly \$41.7 million more. The total economic contribution from dairying in Louisiana, including milk sales, animal sales and additional processing was almost \$67.7 million, a decrease of over \$12.6 million compared to the previous year.

Another component of the state's dairy industry has been the production of goat's milk. While small compared to the dairy cattle industry, dairy goat production has continued to be a viable industry in the state. In 2023 dairy goats were raised by 74 producers. A total of 765 does were reported to have been milked during 2023 producing over 687,000 pounds of goat milk. Many of these producers are using goat milk to make soap, cheeses, lotion, cheesecakes and pies. These products vary in price depending on the producer and the geographical location where they market their products. The gross farm income of the dairy goat industry was estimated at \$0.41 million in 2023, up from the \$0.31 million generated in 2022.

When combined, milk production from cattle, milk production from goats and the sale of dairy cattle animals generated a gross farm value of \$26.35 million in 2023, which is down from the \$31.1 million generated in 2022. Value-added activities associated with the dairy industry contributed another \$42.4 million in economic activity to the state in 2023. Total economic activity (gross farm value plus value-added) of the Louisiana dairy (dairy cattle and goats) industry was estimated at \$68.78 million in 2023, down from the over \$80 million generated in 2022.

## Horses

The horse industry continues to be a significant component of the agricultural economy in Louisiana. The horse industry has traditionally been able to be categorized into three sectors: racing, show or competition, and recreational. In terms of number of horse owners, the breakdown of the industry in 2023 into these three sectors was 9% racing, 14% show or competition, and 77% recreational. In 2023, the breakdown of the horse industry by percentage of total gross farm value generated by each sector was 28% racing, 41% show or competition, and 31% recreational.

The state's racehorse industry in 2023 involved 1,642 breeders who owned 5,517 mares that produced 4,733 foals that sold for \$28.4 million. Breeders also owned 776 stallions that were bred to 6,088 mares, generating income from stud fees of \$15.2 million. The total gross farm value generated from racehorse production was \$43.6 million. An additional 2,051 racehorse owners had 8,864 racehorses in training or on the track in Louisiana, with a gross farm value of \$88.6 million. The gross farm value of the entire race sector (owners' and breeders' activities) of the horse industry in 2023 was \$132.3 million, not including receipts or fees from racing events or gaming.

The show and competition horse industry (horse shows, barrel racing, cutting, roping, team penning and others) includes 1,611 breeders who own 5,856 mares that produced 4,790 foals that sold for \$19.1 million during 2023. These breeders owned 648 stallions that bred with 4,110 mares, generating \$6.2 million in income from stud fees. The total income generated from show and competition horse production was \$25.3 million. Another 3,804 owners competed on their 16,328 horses, which had a gross farm value of \$163.3 million. The total gross farm value of the show and competition sector of the horse industry was \$188.6 million in 2023, not including the income generated from showing and associated activities.

A large portion of the horse industry, both in terms of owners and horses, is recreational. Horses have been used for comfort, exercise and enjoyment for quite some time. Approximately 9,909 recreational horse owners in Louisiana bred 22,574 mares and sold 17,370 foals during 2023 for \$19.1 million. These horse enthusiasts owned 2,330 stallions that were bred to 5,607 mares, generating income from stud fees of \$2.8 million. The total income from production in the recreational horse industry was \$21.9 million during 2023. Another 21,294 recreational horse owners have 47,992 horses valued at \$120 million – making the total economic contribution of the recreational horse industry \$141.9 million in 2023.

There was a total of 110,885 horses in Louisiana, owned by 40,286 people, with a gross farm value of \$462.8 million in 2023. Value-added activities contributed an additional \$50.9 million in 2023, so combining farm-gate value and the value-added, the total value of horse sector was \$513.7 million in 2023.

In addition to the estimates of gross farm value and value-added activities, there are other potential impacts of the horse industry to the state's economy. First, the average horse owner has been reported to spend about \$4,000 to \$6,000 annually on items such as feed, tack, equipment, veterinary supplies and medicines. Second, the four racetracks in the state employ many people and have been reported to generate expenditures of over \$1 billion annually. Finally, the show and competition industry conduct numerous events and activities each year and is estimated to generate expenditures of \$200 million annually. The American Horse Council suggests that the total economic impact of horse production and these related activities like horse racing and competitions exceeds \$3 billion annually for the state of Louisiana.

## Poultry

### Broilers and Eggs

Poultry production continues to be the largest animal agricultural industry in Louisiana and is second only to forestry in total economic value for all agricultural commodities. In 2023, 719 Louisiana growers (small producers and commercial operations) produced 977.9 million pounds of broiler meat with a gross farm value of \$713.9 million. While production in 2023 was up from 2022, sharply lower broiler prices resulted in gross farm value decreasing by over \$389 million in 2023. Commercial broilers are produced in 11 parishes: Bienville, Claiborne, Jackson, Lincoln, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Sabine, Union, Vernon, Webster and Winn.

While broiler production is far and away the largest component of the poultry industry in the state, there are several other components that positively contribute to the state's economy. A total of 151 breeder flock producers in 2023 produced 10.9 million dozen hatching eggs with a gross farm value of \$31 million. A total of 76 pullet producers produced over 572,000 pullets with a gross farm value of \$8.9 million. Finally, a total of 1,114 egg producers (small producers and commercial operations) had a total table egg production value of over 19.3 million dozen eggs valued at \$33.8 million.

When all the facets of the poultry industry are combined, the total gross farm value was estimated at \$787.8 million in 2023, up roughly \$468.7 million from 2022. The decrease in 2023 was largely due to sharp decreases in prices in broiler and edible egg prices as prices return to more normal levels from the historic prices experienced in 2022. Value-added activities associated with poultry production added an additional \$768.2 million in economic activity in the state, bringing the total economic impact of the poultry industry to \$1.56 billion in 2023.

### Quail

Quail production in the state generally consists of smaller operations reaching niche markets. In 2023, a total of 18,070 quail were estimated to be produced and sold by 21 producers resulting in a gross farm value of \$81,315. Value-added activities associated with quail production provided an additional \$8,945 bringing the total economic contribution of the quail industry to \$90,260 in 2023.

## Rabbits

The production of rabbits for meat and exhibition involved 442 Louisiana producers during 2023. The rabbit industry produced a total estimated 43,960 pounds for sale in 2023, generating a total of \$220,790 in gross farm income. Of those totals, 24,150 pounds of production were from fryers and the remaining 19,810 pounds were from does. When the value-added activities of \$23,183 are combined with farm level income, the total economic impact of the industry in 2023 is estimated at \$243,973. This was a decrease of roughly \$65,600 from 2022.

## Sheep and Goats

Slight increases in sheep production continued through 2023. Sheep, lambs and wool were produced by 474 producers in 33 Louisiana parishes, compared to 420 in 2022. Similarly, ewe inventory totaled 4,801 head in 2023, an increase of 887 head compared to 2022. This increase continues to reflect the number of producers interested in beginning to raise hair sheep. The total number of lambs that were marketed (slaughter, feeder and club/show lambs) was estimated to be 4,131 in 2023, up from 4,101 marketed in 2022. Producers also marketed 1,526 stocker and 774 cull sheep in 2023. This is an increase of 947 head of stocker and 74 cull sheep compared to 2022. Wool production totaled 9,022 pounds, which was down from 9,604 pounds in 2022. The total gross farm value of the sheep industry remained constant at \$1.3 million in 2023.

The Louisiana meat goat industry during 2023 consisted of an estimated 1,054 producers across 54 parishes, up from 994 producers in 2022. Total inventory of breeding-aged meat does was estimated at 11,600 does in 2023, up approximately 154 head from 2022. Goat producers marketed a total of 7,505 slaughter goats valued at \$1.7 million in 2023, compared with 7,242 head at a value of \$1.4 million in 2022. Stocker goats sold in 2023 numbered 4,272 with a value of \$742,174, an increase of approximately 301 head, but a decrease of \$374,669 from 2022. There were 1,595 cull goats marketed in 2023 at a value of \$281,310. Goats sold as club or show goats numbered 1,543 head, valued at \$617,200, an increase of 318 head and \$127,200 compared to 2002. The gross farm value of meat goats sold in Louisiana during 2023 was \$3.35 million, up nearly \$16,000 from 2022.

## Swine

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The Louisiana swine industry is primarily comprised of relatively small producers. In 2023, a total of 337 producers were estimated to have a total inventory of 2,208 sows with an average sow inventory per producer of roughly seven sows. Other than servicing a local or niche market, most of the swine production in the state is targeted to the show/club pig market. In 2023 a total of 1,940 show pigs were estimated to be sold with a gross farm value of \$776,000, representing roughly 50% of the total gross farm value generated by the swine industry. Sales of feeder pigs, slaughter hogs and culls represent the remaining 50% of the total gross farm value generated by the industry. In 2022, 4,749 feeder pigs were sold for an estimated value of \$188,440. Sales of 2,798 slaughter hogs generated a gross farm value of \$507,636 while the sale of 746 cull animals (sows and boars) generated a gross farm value of \$109,214.

When added together, the gross farm value of all classes of swine is estimated at \$1.58 million for 2023, down from \$1.67 million in 2022. Value-added activities associated with the swine industry are estimated at \$197,661, bringing the total economic impact of the industry to the state economy to \$1.78 million, down from \$1.87 million during the previous year.

## Exotic Animals

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The exotic animal enterprises are a relatively small component of the total agricultural industry. The number of producers statewide was estimated at 50 in 2023, up from 47 in 2022. The total number of animals marketed decreased slightly from 1,662 in 2022 to 1,625 in 2023. Given similar marketings, the total gross farm value in 2023 was similar to the previous year at \$811,400, down marginally from \$830,000 in 2022. When value-added activities added to gross farm value, the total economic impact was estimated at \$896,597, down marginally from \$917,150 in 2022.

# Fisheries and Wildlife Enterprises

Total farm value of all fisheries and wildlife enterprises during 2023 was \$886.3 million, down less than 1% from the \$889.9 million in 2022. Value-added in 2023 was \$632.7 million, up from \$616.4 million in the previous year. Total value of all fisheries and wildlife enterprises to the Louisiana economy for 2023 was \$1.52 billion, up marginally from the \$1.51 billion in 2022.

## Aquaculture

Louisiana has long been recognized for supporting one of the most diverse aquaculture industries in the United States. Species and products such as crawfish, catfish, alligators, oysters, tilapia, baitfish, soft-shelled crawfish and crabs, ornamental fish, baby turtles, a variety of freshwater game fish and other minor species all have been commercialized successfully. Louisiana's producers continue to be among the leaders in the nation in crawfish, oyster, pet turtle and alligator sales.

Farm-raised crawfish continued to be the state's most valuable aquaculture sector in 2023. Growth in demand, both within the state and regionally, has continued to foster expansion of acreage and production, and crawfish production has increasingly been incorporated in other farming operations in recent years as producers look to offset adverse conditions in rice markets. In 2023, however, some industry observers felt that supplies had finally outpaced demand. Estimates from the field in 2023 indicated farm-raised crawfish production occupied over 359 thousand acres, up 9.3% from the previous year. Total harvests, however, were 199.1 million pounds, an increase of less than 1%, and gross farm value was \$256.9 million in 2023, down significantly (16%) from \$305.7 million the previous year. Industry observers indicated several situations in which supply probably exceeded demand. Some producers ceased fishing when prices dropped significantly, resulting in lower overall harvest numbers, while others continued to fish at low late-season prices, depressing overall farm-gate values.

A total of 314,544 farmed alligators were harvested in 2023. Although they have historically been Louisiana's second most valuable aquaculture commodity, farm-raised alligators occupied the third-place spot in 2023, with an estimated gross farm value of \$64.9 million. However, this reflected a continuing trend of slowing market demand. Supply and demand imbalances in domestic and world markets, coupled with foreign competition, encouraged producers to take a cautious approach going forward.

Oyster production normally represents the third largest segment of Louisiana's aquaculture industry. The oyster production information reported in this summary represents a one-year lag. Information on Louisiana oyster harvests and sales is compiled by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and provided to the National Marine Fisheries Service, but the final compilation of the data is not available until the middle of the following year. Oyster sales in 2022 rose to 1,118,691 sacks valued at \$76.5 million, up by 11.5% and 14.4%, respectively, from the previous year.

While numerous segments of Louisiana's aquaculture industry continue to provide positive economic impacts to the state, they are significantly smaller than those of crawfish, alligator and oyster production. Pet turtle hatchling production of red-ear sliders continued to decline in 2023, but sales of more valuable species to foreign collectors and enthusiasts helped bolster total farm gate value. Many licensed turtle operations continue to be inactive currently. Fish bait and minnow production continue to evolve to meet the demands of recreational fishers, with out-of-state competition and mergers and acquisitions throughout the industry imposing significant constraints on profitability. In 2023, the estimated gross farm value of the fish bait industry was down from the prior year, and minnow farming numbers reflected a similar trend. Recent increases in farmed catfish production and revenue continued in 2023, with 10.2 million pounds of production valued at \$12.7 million. Other aquaculture species include products such as game fish fingerlings, ornamental fish, soft-shell crabs and crawfish, and other minor species. Each of these commodities has a very limited number of producers.

Examining the economic impact across all commercial enterprises indicates that the total gross farm value of Louisiana aquaculture in 2023 was approximately \$421 million, which was 5% lower than the previous year's total. Value-added multipliers associated with aquaculture value chains (processing, boiling, shucking, packaging, etc.) contributed an additional \$284 million to the state's economy, bringing the total impact of Louisiana's commercial aquaculture to \$705 million in 2023. Additionally, approximately 140,000 private ponds are found throughout Louisiana, totaling some 46,000 acres. Although these private ponds are not included in the 2023 state total for aquaculture, they do have positive

economic impacts for recreation and enhancement of property values. These impacts have been estimated to exceed \$70 million for 2023.

## Fisheries

The harvest of freshwater and marine finfish and shellfish in Louisiana largely contributes to the state's agricultural economy. Fishery landings are recorded by two government agencies, both state and federal. The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries receives monthly reports from the initial buyers (processors, dealers, etc.) who are required to record every transaction via trip tickets. Species weights and dockside sales values of the landings are reported for all commercially harvested species. The National Marine Fisheries Service is also responsible for estimating fisheries landings, using both regional National Marine Fisheries Service data collectors and Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries reports. The information reported here is from those two cooperating sources. All this data is provisional and subject to change.

The freshwater and marine fisheries data presented in the report this year (2023) reflect the calendar year 2022. The one-year lag is necessary to ensure data accuracy. Real-time reports on fisheries landings are not available until four months after the fact, and final data often runs six to 12 months behind. Estimating landings for the second half of the year based on landings reports from the first half is inaccurate. This method of reporting fisheries landings data has been in place since the 2004 Louisiana Summary; data prior to that volume may not be directly comparable to the data reported since 2004 because of using the different estimation methods. To compare state-level landings for years prior to 2004, on a calendar-year basis, please consult the US-NOAA-NMFS website.

One final caveat is that parish totals for fisheries landings will not equal the state total because of legal confidentiality requirements. When there are fewer than three sources in a parish that report landings of a fisheries commodity, the number of landings cannot be publicly released by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries without breaking confidentiality requirements. There may also be parishes reported in this volume for which no landings or values were provided by either of those agencies but for which there was catch. Furthermore, fisheries landings are reported for the parish in which the fish are offloaded – not the parish in which the boat and its crew may be domiciled or the parish where the catches were made. However, producer estimates are based on commercial licenses which are based on the fishermen's domicile.

### Freshwater Fisheries

The freshwater finfish (in order of weight landed) are blue catfish, buffalo, gizzard shad, alligator gar and channel catfish. On a whole, freshwater finfish hold a lower commercial value than marine finfish. Total freshwater finfish value has increased slightly from 2021 to 2022. Landing values in 2021 were \$5.3 million for 12.5 million pounds whereas landing values in 2022 were \$6.0 million for 13.3 million pounds. Landings increased in 2022 by more than 830 thousand pounds. However, the price per pound also increased from \$0.42 to \$0.45, resulting in increased fishery landings value. The total number of freshwater finfish producers increased by 142 in 2022 from 1,920 to 2,062. In most cases, freshwater fish are less valuable than marine fish (excluding menhaden), and on a whole the freshwater finfish fishery (\$6.0 million in 2022 landings) is significantly less than the marine finfish fishery (\$122.1 million in 2022 landings).

Most of the parishes with wild crawfish landings are within the Atchafalaya Basin, aside from St. Tammany, where inflows from both the Mississippi and Red Rivers are controlled by the U.S Army Corp of Engineers. Wild crawfish compete with the farm raised crawfish in the markets and wild volumes are largely constrained by the floodwater events in the Atchafalaya basin. The difference is minimal; however, wild crawfish tend to be bigger in size and have a slightly different flavor due to their diet. In 2022, wild crawfish landings were down 24% from 2021 at 8.3 million pounds compared to 10.9 million pounds. A sharp increase in prices helped to offset the lower landings leaving the total gross farm value mostly unchanged at \$14.3 million. Crawfish average price per pound was \$1.72 over the season. The number of wild caught crawfish producers decreased in 2022 relative to 2021 by 228.

Overall, landings from the freshwater fisheries sector had a gross value of \$20.3 million in 2022.

### Marine Fisheries

Marine finfish landings for food are varied and complex, with about 50 different species being landed for a total of 763 million pounds in 2022. This was a 34% increase from 2021, when 568 million pounds of marine finfish were landed in Louisiana. Beginning in 2020, menhaden were included in marine fisheries statistics when historically they have been



kept separate. The volume of menhaden catch can represent up to 99% of the marine fish landings category but only 90% of the value. The value of marine finfish landings in Louisiana in 2022 was \$122.1 million, which was a significant increase from 2021 when landings were valued at \$69 million. With the exclusion of menhaden, the top five landed species were red snapper, non-menhaden herrings, black drum, sheepshead and king mackerel. By value, (also, excluding menhaden), the top five species were red snapper, black drum, yellowfin tuna, king mackerel and swordfish. The aggregate price per pound for marine fish was \$0.16 which largely represents the price per pound for menhaden. This was up from 2021 where the aggregate price per pound was \$0.12. The low price per pound reflects the value of menhaden as a nonfood fish. While this fish is too small and oily to eat, it is used in a variety of different ways including fertilizers, animal feeds, omega-3 dietary supplements, cosmetics, as well as bait. The prices of these products are a function of the world supply of oils and meals.

In 2022, 7.2 million pounds of oysters were harvested by 667 fishermen, or about 1.1 million sacks. This is an 8% increase from landings in 2021 and a 106% increase from the historically low year in 2020 where only 3.5 million pounds were landed. In 2021, the price per pound for oysters was \$10.57 (\$68.36 per sack), an increase from \$7.90 in 2021 (\$51.08 per sack). To calculate prices per sack, an assumption of 6.47 pounds of shucked oyster meat per sack was used. The gross value of oysters harvested in 2022 was \$76.5 million, an increase of 44.6% from \$52.9 million in 2021.

Louisiana hard crab landings usually range from 40 to 50 million pounds annually made up of almost 100% blue crab with less than 0.1% of stone crab claws. Blue crab landings were just over 51 million pounds, fished by 2,559 license holders and valued at \$91.5 million in 2022. This was a 3.6% increase in landings from 49.5 million pounds but a 2% decrease in value from \$93.4 million in 2021 as prices fell by roughly \$0.10 per pound in 2022.

Peeler or buster crabs are blue crabs that are close to molting their shell. These crabs are sold to soft shell facilities to produce soft shell crab. For many years now, the soft-shell industry has been in decline. In 2021, 3,492 pounds of soft shell were produced. In 2022, 3,322 pounds were produced valued at \$30,203.

Louisiana shrimp landings in 2022 consisted of three species: white shrimp, brown shrimp and Atlantic seabob shrimp. Historically, Louisiana shrimp harvest landings and values have been split between white shrimp and brown shrimp (~50%) with a small fraction of landings represented by pink shrimp and seabobs (less than 1%). In 2022, the aggregate shrimp landings were 80.7 million pounds valued at \$112.2 million. This was an increase in landings from 2021 by 9% from 74.1 million pounds, but a decrease of 14.1% in the value from \$130.5 million. The reduction in value was a result of a sharp decrease in average price in 2022 falling to \$1.39 per pound from \$1.76 per pound in 2021.

In 2022, marine fisheries landings in Louisiana were valued at \$325.7 million, an increase from \$292.9 million in 2021.

## Fur

As reported by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the total value of the 2022-2023 furbearer harvest was estimated at \$85,649, up from the estimated total value of \$42,662 reported in 2021-2022. The total number of trapping licenses sold decreased from 3,180 reported in 2021-2022 to 2,989 reported in 2022-2023. The total number of pelts sold in 2022-2023 was 5,463, up from 4,241 pelts sold in 2021-2022. Over 80% of pelts were harvested from beaver (2,039), raccoons (1,379), and river otter (1,106). The average price paid per pelt in 2022-2023 ranged from \$0.85 for opossum (n = 4 reported) to \$34.50 for bobcat (n = 192 reported).

The total number of nutria harvested under the Coast-wide Nutria Control Program during the 2022-2023 season was 221,404, which was up from 203,824 reported in 2021-2022. The total value of incentive paid for nutria harvest during 2022-2023 was estimated at \$1,328,424, up from \$1,222,944 reported in 2021-2022.

## Hunting Lease Enterprises

The value of recreational hunting in Louisiana is estimated by the income derived from hunting lease enterprises. The number of producers who leased land in the state during the 2022-2023 hunting season was estimated at 4,752, up from 4,634 reported during the 2021-2022 hunting season. The 2022-2023 estimate consists of 3,316 individuals who leased their land for upland game hunting (primarily white-tailed deer and wild turkey) and 1,436 individuals who leased their land for waterfowl hunting.

In 2022-2023, approximately 3.9 million acres were leased for upland game hunting and approximately 1.4 million acres were leased for waterfowl hunting. Both estimates are down from the previous year when approximately 4.7 million acres were leased for upland game hunting and approximately 1.5 million acres were leased for waterfowl hunting. In 2022-2023, the estimated value for upland game hunting leases was approximately \$68.9 million and \$39.6 million for waterfowl, both down from the previous year. The estimated price per acre of leased land for hunting purposes in 2022-2023 was \$17.50 per acre for upland game and \$28.40 per acre for waterfowl.

## Honey

Honey yields in Louisiana were lower in 2023 for two reasons related to weather. The first incident occurred late in March of 2023 when a hard freeze occurred. This freeze damaged the flower buds of the Chinese tallow trees, the main nectar plant for beekeepers.

The next incident was the record drought temperatures. Beekeepers anecdotally complained about losing hives due to the heat and dry conditions. In 2023, the total number of hives was estimated at 31,460, down from 32,590 in 2022. The large reductions in hives over the last three years are believed to be primarily a result of the adverse weather conditions (hurricanes in 2020 and 2021 and drought conditions in 2023). Despite the lower hive numbers, total honey production increased marginally in 2023 at 2.4 million pounds as compared to 2.2 million pounds in 2022. With slightly higher production and prices (prices in 2023 was \$2.61 per pound versus \$2.44 per pound in 2022), total gross farm value was up in 2023 at \$6.3 million from the \$5.3 million in 2022.



# Plant Enterprises

The gross farm value of all plant enterprises was roughly \$4.57 billion in 2023, a decrease of 3.7% from the \$4.75 billion in 2022. Value added was \$3.94 billion for all plant commodities during 2023, down from \$4.21 billion in 2022. Total value of all plant crop enterprises to the Louisiana economy was \$8.51 billion in 2023, down from \$8.95 billion in 2022.

## Cotton

In 2023, 113,687 acres of cotton was harvested in the state of Louisiana which compares to 183,536 in 2022 and 102,787 in 2021. Approximately 53% of the acres in 2023 were irrigated. Yields across irrigated and dryland acres averaged 875 pounds of lint per acre which compares to 946 and 1,090 of lint per acre in 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Gross farm value of cotton lint sales was \$73.1 million in 2023, with \$44.4 million from lint harvested on irrigated land and \$28.7 million from sales of lint harvested from nonirrigated land. Sales of cotton seed contributed an additional \$21.5 million. Gross farm value of all cotton sales was \$94.6 million, with value added contributing \$23.7 million, so the total value of cotton production in 2023 was \$118.3 million.

## Feed Grains

In 2023, there were 685,872 acres of feed grains harvested in the state, up nearly 220,000 acres from the 466,067 harvested in 2022. Corn acres were solely responsible for this increase with both grain sorghum and oats experiencing year-over-year decreases in harvested acres. Harvested acres of corn increased from 434,445 in 2022 to 678,797 in 2023. Grain sorghum saw harvested acres fall dramatically going from roughly 26,780 acres in 2022 to 6,554 acres in 2023. Similarly, harvested acres of oats fell from 1,033 acres in 2022 to 521 acres in 2023.

The significant increase in corn acres helped to more than offset impacted yields from the drought in 2023 and slightly lower feed grain prices to push total gross farm value for feed grains higher. Total gross farm value for feed grains increased to \$750.2 million from \$549.8 million in 2022. Value-added for feed grains was estimated to be \$131.3 million in 2023. When combined with the gross farm value, the total value of feed grain production in Louisiana was estimated to be \$881.5 million in 2023, up from \$646.0 million in 2022.

### Corn

There were 678,797 acres of corn harvested in 2023 which compares to 443,445 in 2022, and 545,373 in 2021. Corn yields in 2023 averaged 176.9 bushels per acre which is a slight increase above the 2022 level of 174.9 bushels per acre but is sharply below the average yield in 2021 which was roughly 190 bushels per acre. Approximately 74% of the corn acres were produced on irrigated land in 2023. Prior to 2023, the five-year average for corn yields in Louisiana was 182.2 bushels per acre.

Gross farm value of corn production in 2023 was 747.1 million, up substantially from the 2022 value of \$535.6 million. The large increase in gross farm value was almost solely due to the large increase in corn acres in 2023.

### Grain Sorghum

In 2023, 6,554 acres of grain sorghum were harvested throughout the state. This compares to 26,780 acres harvested in 2022 and 50,097 acres harvested in 2021. Grain sorghum yields in 2022 averaged 76.9 bushels per acre which compares to 78 and 82.4 bushels per acre in 2022 and 2021, respectively.

The gross farm value of grain sorghum production in 2023 was roughly \$3 million, down from \$14 million in 2022, mainly due to decreased harvested acres, which negatively affected the gross value.

### Oats

In 2023, three producers harvested 521 acres of oats in the state, compared to 1,033 acres in 2022. Yields averaged 39.7 bushels per acre in 2023, down from 42.3 per acre in 2022. Given lower acreage and yields, total production was lower in 2023 as compared to the previous year. Total production was estimated at 20,693 in 2023 as compared to 43,699

bushels in 2022. Smaller production levels coupled with lower oat prices led to a significant decrease in gross farm value. The gross farm value for oats was estimated at \$82,979 in 2023, down sharply from \$237,284 in 2022.

## Forestry

Louisiana's timber industry faced significant headwinds in 2023 due to economic uncertainties, a sluggish housing market and excessive heat conditions. The state's timber harvest decreased from 27 million tons in 2022 to 24.5 million tons, a decline of around 9.3%. This drop, coupled with mixed pricing trends for various timber products, impacted the industry's overall performance.

Inflation and high mortgage rates continued to weigh on key lumber and timber end-users, leading to fluctuations in prices. Pine sawtimber experienced a modest increase, rising from an average of \$26.41 per ton in 2022 to \$26.84 per ton in 2023. Oak sawtimber prices also saw an uptick, climbing from \$43.81 per ton to \$45.25 per ton. However, mixed hardwood sawtimber faced a decline, dropping from \$33.85 per ton in 2022 to \$31.56 per ton in 2023. Prices for pine chip-n-saw decreased from \$19.64 per ton to \$18.05 per ton, while pine pulpwood prices continued their downward trend, decreasing from \$8.05 per ton to \$6.90 per ton. Hardwood pulpwood prices also dipped slightly from \$8.81 per ton to \$8.61 per ton.

Despite these challenges, Louisiana's timber industry generated a total stumpage value in the range of million units in 2023. Pine log timber remained the most significant contributor, followed by pulpwood pine timber and chip-n-saw pine timber. Hardwood and cypress log timber and pulpwood hardwood timber had smaller shares.

Compared to the total stumpage value in 2022, the timber industry in Louisiana experienced a decrease of approximately 9.6% in 2023. This decline can be attributed to the reduced timber harvest and the mixed pricing dynamics driven by economic uncertainties and a slowdown in the housing market, as well as the impact of unfavorable weather conditions, which likely hindered operations.

Looking ahead to 2024, Louisiana's timber industry is expected to navigate through these economic challenges and adapt to evolving market conditions. The state's abundant timber resources and attractive prices for pine sawtimber are likely to continue drawing investment interest. However, the pace of recovery in the housing market and the overall economic situation will play a crucial role in determining the industry's performance and future growth prospects.

## Fruit Crops

Commercial fruit production predominately occurs on a smaller scale in Louisiana but there are some larger producers. Some growers are diversifying and planting a variety of fruiting plants to ensure multiple harvest windows and to expand agrotourism appeal. A late freeze event at the end of March significantly impacted fruit production in Louisiana. The north and central portions of the state were more impacted but some producers in the southern part of the state were affected as well. Early flowering fruits and cultivars were damaged more than later flowering ones. Louisiana suffered from extreme heat and drought conditions for much of the summer and fall of 2023. Producers without irrigation experienced significant heat and drought stress in their plantings.

In 2023, commercial fruit crops were harvested on roughly 1,595 acres. Gross farm value for commercial fruit production, combining both small fruit and tree fruit crops, was \$32.9 million in 2023. The three crops that bring in the most revenue are citrus at a gross farm value of \$4.9 million, strawberries at a gross farm value of \$11.6 million and blueberries at a gross farm value of \$7.3 million.

Commercial citrus production is concentrated in the lower portions of Louisiana and can be impacted negatively by late freezes and active hurricane seasons. Citrus growers primarily produce satsumas, followed by navel oranges, and then assorted other citrus crops. There are several diseases that are threats to the citrus industry, namely citrus greening and canker. Homeowner and small-scale commercial citrus production in northern parts of the growing range have struggled due to numerous hard freeze events. Tree loss from cold injury has led to an increased consumer demand for citrus fruit and trees in that range.

Strawberry production is primarily concentrated in Tangipahoa and Livingston parishes. Strawberries are a high value commodity that is highly perishable. This perishable nature makes them very sensitive to disease and weather conditions.

Spring freeze events caused a delay in the strawberry season. The increased usage of row covers during freeze events led to some fields experiencing increased disease pressure from pathogens spread by the covers.

Commercial blueberry production occurs in the northern part of the state, notably in Caddo, DeSoto and Moorehouse parishes. Blueberries are grown for both local retail sale and wholesale processing within Louisiana. The hard freeze event in March was detrimental to blueberry production in the state as it occurred during the flowering window for many cultivars.

Two other notable fruit crops that are emerging in popularity and production in Louisiana are blackberries and mayhaws. Mayhaws were significantly impacted by the March freeze event and production in central and north Louisiana was greatly reduced. Demand for mayhaws is currently above the supply leading to a higher price of \$4.50 a pound for improved orchard grown selections. Blackberries had a gross farm value of \$3.7 million and mayhaws had a gross farm value of \$2.7 million in 2023.

## Commercial Greenhouse Vegetables

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Greenhouse production of vegetable crops offers Louisiana growers almost yearlong environmental control to optimize vegetable production. The summer months July and August can be challenging to produce crops in greenhouses, typically resulting in high cooling bills. Additionally, during this time, growers must adjust their seeding rates of leafy greens to accommodate for growth potential before bolting. Therefore, we often notice greenhouse growers take a break during these hot months to sanitize and repair greenhouses.

The growth rate of lettuce, tomatoes and cucumbers per square foot is incredible. If you are willing to maintain the structure, you will be amazed at the amount of produce you can grow in a small area as compared to field crop production. If building a greenhouse is too expensive, Louisiana growers may consider constructing a high tunnel. A high tunnel is a greenhouse where you plant in the ground rather than in bagged culture or hydroponic systems. The Natural Resources Conservation Service offers the Louisiana Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQUIP) to help cover partial costs of high tunnel construction for Louisiana vegetable farmers. High tunnels provide growers with season extension. High tunnels allow producers to start warm season crops two to three months early and get to the market early, or to extend warm season crops into the winter because the high tunnel provides several degrees of protection from winter conditions.

There is room for expansion in Louisiana for controlled environmental production of vegetable crops. We import a good deal of our vegetables out of season and the LSU AgCenter would like to see more local produce offered during the off season. The three main crops grown in Louisiana greenhouses include tomatoes, cucumbers, and lettuce (categorized most often as other). Estimated 2023 gross farm values of greenhouse production in Louisiana are \$3.6 million (tomatoes), \$113,067 (cucumbers), and \$201,450 (other, most notably lettuce).

## Hay Sold

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Hay production for commercial sales is a limited part of the total hay production in Louisiana. Nevertheless, hay produced from 199 acres of alfalfa and 397,166 acres of grasslands was sold by 3,674 producers in 2023. Yields averaged 1.6 tons per acre from the grasslands harvested for sale and 5.4 tons per acre from the alfalfa harvested for sale. Production included 617,902 tons of grass hay and 1,076 tons of alfalfa hay. Compared to numbers reported in 2022, the acreage of grasslands used for commercial hay production increased by 11%.

Weather conditions were conducive for optimum hay production during the early part of the growing season in 2023. However, drought conditions were present throughout the state in the summer months and had a negative impact on hay production for the remainder of 2023. Grass hay yields were 33% lower in 2023 as compared to 2022. Gross farm value of all hay sales, including some minor alfalfa production, was \$110.4 million, which was a decrease of 17.4% from the previous year. Despite higher prices, the lower production levels resulting from the drought in 2023 resulted in the lower farm gate value.

## Home Vegetable Gardens

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In typical years the number of home gardens fluctuates greatly with people's interest and the economy. When economic conditions are weak there tends to be additional interest in producing their own food in the face of rising food costs. Also, with

the conditions created by the covid pandemic in 2020 and 2021, there was a renewed interest in home gardens. The National Gardening Association found that 19 million new gardeners were gained during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Vegetable gardening not only provides food but is also reported to reduce stress and provide a mental break from the day. Research conducted by the USDA indicated approximately one in three households have some kind of garden, including backyard fruit trees, vegetable plots, berry patches, etc.

With this assumption of a garden for one in every three households, a methodology based on parish population data was developed to estimate the number of gardens in each parish of the state. Louisiana population in 2023 was estimated at 4.57 million people. Assuming 2.6 people in every household, the total number of households in the state is approximately 1.76 million. Further, assuming roughly 35% of the households have home gardens, translates in a total of roughly 615,000 home gardens in the state. Based on the USDA study, the average value of a home garden was roughly \$525 in 2008. Using annual price changes of a mix of vegetables and fruits that would be believed to be grown in the typical Louisiana home garden, that estimated value from 2008 is adjusted annually to estimate a current value of home gardens. For 2023, the estimated value of a home garden was calculated at \$627. Given these assumptions, the estimated gross farm value of home vegetable gardens was estimated at \$386 million.

## Nursery Crops

The commercial nursery industry in Louisiana is primarily focused on woody ornamentals (trees and shrubs), floriculture and bedding plants, foliage crops and some fruit and nut tree nursery stock production. In 2020, commercial nursery crop production in Louisiana had a record year in sales, with expansion of housing causing a demand for plants, plus a necessary replanting after catastrophic storms and floods. The pandemic contributed to estimates of well over 15 million new gardeners nationwide. Moreover, during stay-at-home orders of 2020, many Louisiana residents put time, effort, and money into landscapes causing a major influx of customers and purchasing. With the nursery industry being declared “essential” the industry was able to take full advantage of the increase in spending. Heavy rains, hard freezes and hurricanes hit the ornamental production area in 2020.

These growth trends continued into 2021 and slowed slightly in 2022. The 2023 season saw a major statewide drought and record heat for much of the summer, damaging a decent amount of nursery stock. However, the damage to existing landscape plantings far surpassed the damage to the stock, resulting in greater sales than 2022. The nursery industry finished 2023 very strong, with many growers indicating that they were able to sell as many plants as they could grow. Multiple large operations expanded acreage in 2023 as well adding to additional nursery capacity to an already strong industry. The total gross farm value across all nursery crops was estimated at \$125.1 million, a 3.2% increase over the previous year.

## Peanuts

In 2023, six producers planted 1,906 acres of peanuts compared to three producers and 1,938 acres in 2022. Harvested acreage was 1,938 and 1,807 for 2022 and 2023, respectively. Yields averaged 3,701 pounds per acre in 2023. Total production was 6,690,280 pounds with a value of \$2.56 million. Soilborne disease (stem rot) pressure continued to plague peanut fields and increased input cost associated with fungicide applications.

## Pecans

Improved pecan orchards are predominately located in the central and northern parts of the state with native trees still having a significant presence in south Louisiana. Most recent plantings are of improved cultivars. As certain cultivars fall out of favor, they can occasionally fall within the native production category in classification, management, and commercial viability. About half of improved variety acreage in Louisiana is managed to control diseases, insect pests and weeds. Low wholesale prices mean more producers are moving to low-input practices over high-input management strategies. Most new plantings of improved pecan cultivars are small scale operations that are focusing on lower input selections that can still be productive with less intensive management practices.

The 2023 harvest is estimated at 6.9 million pounds. This is up from the 5.7 million pounds estimated in 2022. The

2023 pecan production season was also the “on” phase of the alternate bearing cycle for much of the state. Rain was frequent and distributed evenly for much of the early spring in Louisiana which encouraged a large crop set for the season. A late freeze event at the end of March burned emerging blooms and foliage on some pecan trees. The Elliot variety was hit hard by the freeze event especially in northern parts of the state which caused a significant reduction of Elliot pecan production. Dry weather conditions escalated to severe drought and heat in the summer and fall which negatively influenced kernel quality. A few cultivars that have become marginal in Louisiana due to pecan scab were able to produce a crop due to the drier weather conditions. The drier conditions significantly reduced disease pressure this year but may have a negative effect on yield next year. Some pecan orchards are starting to experience several “off” years in their production cycle due to older cultivars and unfavorable production conditions.

Commercial pecan production contributed to Louisiana with an estimated total gross farm value of \$7.6 million in 2023; an increase from an estimated \$6.4 million in 2022. This increase was due to the increase of pecan yield from the “on” production phase. The production of improved cultivars increased in 2023 to about 3.8 million pounds, compared to 3.2 million pounds in 2022. Native trees increased their market share in 2023 with 3.1 million pounds being reported compared to 2.5 million pounds in 2022. Overall wholesale prices for pecans slightly increased in 2022. Wholesale prices in 2023 were \$0.73 per pound for native and \$1.39 per pound for improved pecans. The wholesale prices for improved pecans varied across the state and between producers dependent on orchard management practices and cultivar selection.

## Rice

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Rice remains an extremely important crop in Louisiana agriculture, ranking among the top four in acreage and value. Approximately 461,430 acres were planted in 2023. The Rice Variety by Parish Survey conducted annually by extension agents indicated that Louisiana planted approximately 83% long grain, 16% medium grain and 1% special purpose rice varieties.

In 2023, the statewide rice average yield was estimated at 7,150 pounds per acre (44.1 barrels or 158.9 bushels per acre), up slightly from 6,950 pounds per acre in 2022. A total of 33 million hundredweights of rice was produced on 461,430 harvested acres in 2023. The gross farm value in 2023 for rice produced was \$577.6 million, up from \$436.2 million in 2022. When value-added activities of \$192.3 million are considered, the total economic impact of the rice industry was estimated at \$769.9 million, up from \$581.4 million in 2022.

After the first wave of rice planting in early March, two significant freeze events stopped planting until warmer conditions resumed planting in early April. Slow emergence and reduced seedling vigor in cold conditions lead to seedling disease and stand reductions. Rice herbicide injury also affected many acres due to rice not growing because of cold weather during the early season. North Louisiana stayed cold and didn’t start planting until later than normal. The dry weather that followed planting reduced most diseases in rice, although we did have some kernel smut in some varieties. Very few problems with insects were reported throughout the state but we continue to see some damage from stem borer feeding in some areas.

Despite different planting dates, the extreme hot and dry conditions resulted in most of the rice maturing at about the same time. This caused much of the rice in southwest Louisiana to be ready for harvest within a three-week period. Unfortunately, not all the rice could be harvested within optimal grain moisture levels. Lower-than-optimal harvest moisture caused milling quality to fall significantly. In addition, daytime temperatures near or above 100 F coupled with high nighttime temperatures during critical flowering and grain filling stages caused reduced grain fill and lower overall yields.

Despite the challenges with the rice crop in 2023, favorable conditions existed for the ratoon crop and resulted in higher-than-normal yields, with many reports of ratoon yields in the high 20s and low 30s per barrel per acre. The strong ratoon crop in 2023 helped to support the overall state average yield at 44.1 barrels per acre (7,150 pounds). This was a slight increase over the previous year. The better-than-expected yields were a pleasant surprise for many producers as high irrigation demand and high input prices caused production costs to increase. An increase in rice prices in 2023 helped to partially offset the higher production costs.

## Sod and Turfgrass Production

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During 2023, sod was produced by 21 Louisiana sod farmers on 2,083 acres of fine turfgrasses, compared to 14 sod producers farming 2,385 acres in 2022. Despite the increase in the reported number of producers, total production acreage continued a declining trend experienced over the last several years. This contraction in acreage may be linked to the lack of available labor and increased production cost. About 60% of the sod acreage in Louisiana is centipedegrass and about one-third is St. Augustinegrass. The remaining acreage is divided among hybrid bermudagrass and zoysia. Zoysia demand has increased over the last several years and remains as more trouble-free alternative to St. Augustinegrass and centipedegrass. Shipping costs are always a major component in the eventual price of sod. Out-of-state sod farms remained a major competitor for our Louisiana producers, especially in the southern Louisiana market.

The gross farm value of sod and turfgrass sales in 2023 was estimated to be \$14.8 million, down from \$16.9 million in 2022. This reduction in gross farm value is directly attributable to the contraction of the industry that occurred in 2023. Value-added activities for turfgrass production were estimated at \$11.1 million, so the total value of sod and turfgrass production in Louisiana during 2023 was \$25.9 million.

## Soybeans

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In 2023, 1.03 million acres of soybeans were planted by 1,501 producers. A total of 1.02 million acres were harvested with an average yield of 38.8 bushels per acre. The total production for soybeans in 2023 was 39.4million bushels. In 2023, there was a decrease of 20.8 million bushels of soybeans produced compared to the 2022 cropping season. At \$13.88 per bushel, the average unit price for soybeans in 2023 decreased \$0.11 per bushel from 2022.

There was a fast start to the soybean planting season in 2023. The planting season began during the first week of March. However, a freeze on March 20 killed the soybean plants in some fields. The planting progress was ahead of the five-year average until the week ending on May 28. Extreme heat and drought caused excessive stress on soybean production across the state. The statewide crop was rated as 91% good to excellent on June 11. However, the condition rating decreased almost every week from mid-June until harvest. On Sept. 24, only 42% of the crop was rated as good to excellent and 34% was rated as poor to very poor.

## Sugarcane

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In 2023, sugarcane was grown on 532,914 acres in 25 Louisiana parishes. An estimated 490,280 acres were available for harvest. The 11 raw sugar factories in the state processed 15,774,657 tons of sugarcane. The average yield of cane produced from each harvested acre was 32.2 tons/acre. The average sugar recovery at the sugar factories was 233 pounds of sugar (96° pol) per ton of cane. The yield of commercially recoverable sugar produced per harvested acre was approximately 7,509 pounds.

The 2023 sugarcane growing season had an early start with above average temperatures for February. A mid-March freeze killed crop regrowth causing a restart of new growth as temperatures warmed. Rainfall was below normal for the spring. Spring cultivation, herbicide applications, and fertilization were made in a timely fashion. Sugarcane brown rust levels were low. The dry weather continued into the summer and early fall. Populations of the sugarcane borer and Mexican rice borer (MRB) were low because of the dry conditions. Those growers that could irrigate the cane crop did so. There was slightly more rain in the southeastern parishes, which helped produce high sugar yields in these areas. The western and northern sugarcane growing regions were more affected by the drought. About 1,554 acres of sugarcane were not harvested due to drought.

Poor sugarcane growth due to drought caused a delay in planting. More growers switched to billet planting in 2023. The Louisiana sugar industry was spared of any tropical storms. The crop remained erect for most of the planting and harvest season.

Most of the 2023 harvest season was dry, which had a beneficial effect on sugar recovery. The dry weather also allowed for some post-harvest cultivation of fields and plowing out of fields for replanting. Fallow fields were precision graded and rows pulled up. No severe freezes occurred through the end of harvest. Raw sugar and molasses prices were good, which helped offset yield loss due to the drought.

## Sweet Potatoes

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The 2023 Louisiana sweet potato season saw an estimated 5,403.3 acres planted across Louisiana, predominantly in West Carroll, Acadia, Franklin, Richland, Morehouse, and Avoyelles parishes. This marked a 23.1% decrease from the 2022 season, largely due to grower attrition in Avoyelles Parish. Only 42 acres went unharvested in 2023, a significant improvement compared to the 731 unharvested acres in 2022.

The 2023 growing conditions were challenging due to the drought that plagued Louisiana. Thankfully, the state yields were strong averaging over 506 bushels per acre, though it was a costly crop as irrigation, in some instances, was estimated to increase production cost by 30%.

In the northern region, the crop was mostly planted under favorable conditions, while the southern region faced drought conditions for the majority of the production season. By late June, drought conditions became prevalent statewide and remained throughout harvest. Additionally, excessive heat with temperatures often exceeding 100 F in July and August compounded the growers' challenges. Where irrigation was feasible, it helped maintain strong yields and above average pack-out percentages, however, in areas without irrigation, yields were notably reduced.

The farm gate value for sweet potatoes in 2023 was \$47.3 million, with \$17 million from processing and \$30.3 million from the fresh market. Although only 38% of marketed bushels were sold fresh, they commanded a disproportionately high value compared to the 62% processed, highlighting the premium on fresh market sweet potatoes. Unfortunately, the fresh market is highly competitive, requiring Louisiana growers to compete not only with each other but also with producers from surrounding states. Moving into 2024 Initial reports suggest that acreage will align closely with that of 2023.

## Vegetables, Commercial

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Louisiana vegetable producers are a diverse hard-working group of people. Farm size varies throughout the state. Part-time and full-time growers earn livable wages on farms ranging from an acre to several hundred acres. Most Louisiana vegetable farms are 5-10 acres in size. Small farms are family run and operated while larger farms employ outside H2A labor. Because of Louisianas mild climate, growers can plant and harvest over forty types of vegetable crops and within those crops, many cultivars of each type. You will find Louisiana-grown vegetables for sale at roadside stands, farmers' markets, Community Supported Agriculture subscriptions, direct from the farm, local grocery stores, and food banks.

The 2023 spring and summer growing season was unusually dry. Louisiana received about half of the annual rainfall during 2023. This drastic change in climate did not affect vegetable crops as much as expected. Many vegetable producers use drip irrigation on the smaller acreage crops and waterwheels (overhead irrigation) on the large acreage fields. Drip irrigation is used to maintain soil moisture. Because we had little to no rain in the spring and summer, the irrigation ran for longer periods of time, drastically increasing irrigation bills for growers but not lowering expected yields. Another disadvantage of the dry weather was an increase in insect pressure.

Louisiana is a paradise for insects with our mild weather and lush growth of plants for feeding. However, the 2023 drought kept weeds at bay and devastated nonirrigated crops. Towards the end of the 2023 summer, growers noted an increase in insect pressure in irrigated fields, where there was green foliage for insects to eat. On the other hand, the lack of rain helped reduce overall disease pressure for vegetable producers. As much as possible, Louisiana producers try to keep their foliage dry (thus the usage of drip irrigation). With the reduction in rain came a reduction in spread of fungal spores. Louisiana growers could increase the time between fungicide sprays and saw an overall reduction in disease during the 2023 spring and summer months. The Louisiana vegetable industry is looking forward to a slightly wetter 2024 spring and summer season.

In 2023, the total gross farm value of all vegetable crops was estimated at \$44.1 million, down from \$58.8 million in 2022. This reduction was a function of both slightly lower average prices and lower production levels due to drought conditions for many vegetable crops. The top three vegetable crops in terms of gross farm value were field tomatoes at \$10 million, watermelons at \$8.1 million, and bell peppers at \$4.2 million.

## Wheat

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There were 81 producers that planted 43,241 acres in 2023, compared to 109 producers and 41,832 acres in 2022. Harvest conditions were favorable; however, a severe freeze during March damaged some of the crop. Harvested acres were 41,400 and 42,323 in 2022 and 2023, respectively. Average yield was 56.04 bushels per acre in 2023. Total production for 2023 was 2.37 million bushels with a value of \$17.1 million. Scab (*Fusarium* head blight) and other foliar diseases were not severe.
