II. Current Position Description

The assistant communications specialist/assistant director of graphic design and publications is an experienced, highly organized and deadline-oriented manager. This person is charged with supervising three full-time faculty positions on a team of eight people, with two additional student workers. The team works with LSU AgCenter faculty to develop numbered and non-numbered publications, educational materials, digital and marketing materials, event displays and signage. Those include but are not limited to publications (printed and online), electronic newsletters, curricula, illustrations and other visuals, plus graphic design elements and electronic documents as needed for news stories, videos and the web. Other materials include large displays with collateral materials for educational events, trade shows and other exhibit opportunities for the LSU AgCenter. This person works closely and collaboratively with other communications team members, information technology employees and subject-matter experts to consult, design and produce messaging and materials that support the LSU AgCenter's mission. The production of creative and educational materials involves designing with the latest versions of software for page layout, illustration, digital animation and photo enhancing such as Adobe Creative Cloud (InDesign, Illustrator, Photoshop and Acrobat) and Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, Publisher and PowerPoint), as well as digital asset management. A strong understanding of traditional media, as well as digital and social media, is required. A knowledge of offset and digital printing techniques is critical, plus familiarity with word-processing programs and data management.

The assistant communications specialist/assistant director has a strong understanding of the land-grant university system's outreach mission through publications and manages a high volume of work. This person meets long-term project goals as well as responds to immediate demands with a fast turnaround. This person supports the LSU AgCenter's mission to improve the lives of residents of Louisiana by delivering research-based information through polished products for a variety of diverse audiences.

Other responsibilities include:

- Work closely with the director to set priorities and develop strategies for the team.
- Evaluate incoming projects and assign tasks to team members.
- Run weekly team meetings.
- Monitor workload and job flow of team.
- Help develop and enforce policies on branding and procedures, conferring with publications staff and other LSU AgCenter departments.
- Train full-time graphic design faculty and student workers.
- Serve on hiring committees for LSU AgCenter and LSU College of Agriculture.
- Hold consultations with internal clients to advise on project planning.
- Perform administrative activities including job archiving and tracking via database systems in preparation for State Library of Louisiana and Louisiana Board of Regents reporting.
- Assist in planning and performing duties related to communications/public relations efforts, special events, meetings and conferences.
- Work with the assistant director of communications/marketing on LSU AgCenter marketing and advertising projects.

- Contribute content to social and traditional media advertising.
- Coordinate and ensure consistent messages, presentations and creative directions that reflect brand and marketing goals.
- Conduct trainings on visual communication techniques to LSU AgCenter faculty, staff, agents, students and others involved with teaching, research and extension programs.
- Collaborate with the LSU AgCenter web and information technology teams on the development of graphics for the website and other media.
- Distribute publications on multiple platforms for both digital and print and coordinate deliveries with mail room personnel.
- Work as an effective team member, consultant and manager of multiple projects and maintain an efficient and timely workflow to stay on deadlines and within budgets.
- Work with LSU AgCenter Online Store personnel to ensure publications and inventory are up to date.
- Communicate with scientists and subject-matter specialists of all disciplines of agriculture, family and consumer sciences, and youth development to transform educational data into printed materials and other education products or visual media for intended audiences.
- Stay current with graphics industry software and trends to produce the best and most efficient products for our audiences.
- Participate in professional development activities as related to performance expertise, industry trends and technical proficiencies.

IV. Communications Criteria Form

A. Scholarly, Creative/Innovative Works

Publications, Exhibits, Multimedia

As an in-house graphic designer and communications professional, Roxanne C. Hare has created an average of 120 numbered publications (excluding non-numbered jobs) and graphic design projects annually for the LSU AgCenter for 5 1/2 years for a total of approximately 650. Those include new, revised and reprinted pieces. Hare's specialty is large, complex publications such as magazines and annual reports, all of which give the AgCenter visibility among statewide, national and international audiences.

Hare serves as a creative lead and project consultant, collaborating with researchers and other experts in order to simplify complex information. She demonstrates an understanding of her internal clients' needs and the institution's mission and marries those with diverse audience perspectives. Hare supports a wide variety of interests, such as administration; 4-H Youth Development; Office of Development; LSU College of Agriculture; the Food Innovation Institute (FOODii); statewide research stations; School of Plant, Environmental and Soil Sciences (SPESS); Department of Entomology; and School of Nutrition and Food Sciences, among others. Her designs meet short-term goals for urgent needs and long-term goals for strategic communications and help faculty and staff realize their mission of informing and educating the public.

Hare carries projects from conception to completion. In doing so, she develops project specifications and communicates those with external print vendors, working closely with them to strategize unique and creative concepts. Hare provides quality assurance, monitors jobs for accuracy, and chooses effective paper and materials. She also coordinates invoices between vendors and clients. The accuracy of these steps ensures cost efficiency of AgCenter funds.

In addition, Hare assesses requests from AgCenter faculty and staff, suggests the best format for publication, determines the type of project and assigns each a number for project tracking. She then assigns incoming jobs to designers based on workload and fit.

One of Hare's roles is to design documents that meet requirements for ADA compliance to ensure visual content is inclusive and usable by everyone, regardless of their abilities. This helps keep the AgCenter within legal parameters. Key considerations include color contrast, typography, alternative text, hierarchy, organization and simplicity of graphic elements. Hare tests the accessibility of each document using the checker in Adobe Acrobat and resolves errors before publication.

Webpage Development

One of the final steps in taking a job from conception to completion is a publications website posting. Hare chooses the appropriate design format of each publication's webpage, organizing content such as graphics, tables, photos and copy for optimal presentation so audiences can quickly understand information presented. While Hare most often uses modules, she also performs HTML coding when needed.

State Reporting

Each month, Hare updates the publications list on the website and sends the report to the director of communications and LSU Libraries. Annually, she submits a report of numbered publications to administrators for fiscal reporting to the Louisiana Board of Regents. This ensures the AgCenter is well-represented for state record keeping.

- **Association for Communication Excellence (ACE) 2019 Annual Conference: The Good, The Bad, The Published (June 24-27, 2019):** Hare, along with then news director and current communications Director Tobie Blanchard, presented a session on the processes and challenges of transforming a fundraising newsletter to a magazine.

Communications Programming

- **LSU AgCenter pesticide safety education program:** From 2022 to 2023, Hare worked with extension associates Bryan Gueltig and William "Tad" Kivett, of SPESS, as well communications unit editor Marla Elsea, on developing a pesticide education program through a publication entitled "Ornamental and Turf Pest Management: Study Guide for the Commercial Pesticide Applicator Certification Exam (Subcategory 3)." Published in August 2023, the guide serves to educate those wishing to obtain pesticide certifications in order to meet federal guidelines. Hare created a reader-focused design with easy identification, comprehension and reference highlighting best practices, warnings and horticulture steps, helping the AgCenter meet its educational goals and promoting public safety.

Impact/Response: This publication replaces an outdated manual.

Pesticide Safety Education Program

- **Louisiana State Capitol display project:** In 2023, Hare helped design a program about the AgCenter’s history and offerings to educate visitors to the observation deck at the 34-story Louisiana State Capitol. She strategized with AgCenter administration and communications staff to determine, develop and set up educational content in display cases. Hare, McCallum, Elsea, AgCenter project specialist Lori James, and external and governmental affairs associate Ashley Mullins collaborated to determine the best mix of two- and three-dimensional pieces for maximum visual interest. The area is the first stop at a public destination that frequently sees school tours and the general public, providing not only a method of agricultural education but also an economical means of visibility for the AgCenter.
- **4-H anti-bullying program:** Throughout 2020, Hare worked with 4-H Youth Development instructor Dr. Kimberly J. Williams to create educational materials for teachers statewide on the importance of fighting bullying. She organized, branded and designed a three-unit, 96-page curriculum called “Stand Strong: Creating a Culture of Caring” over a one-year period. Duties included page layout, artistic direction, illustration and printing. Lessons focus on awareness, self-management and collective responsibility, giving teachers educational tools and helping the AgCenter to be instrumental in a topic that is rising in awareness.
- **AgMagic entomology portal (2018, 2019):** Hare worked with the Department of Entomology to plan the flow of exhibits for schoolchildren and the public for this annual event, meeting with the team months in advance to help educate and excite audiences about insects. Hare worked with Dr. Michael Stout and other team members on planning the location of display tables, insect cases, a live bee encasement, a butterfly house, stamping activities and a bug sound exhibit. Hare coordinated budgets, setup, staffing and teardown, as well as outside agencies and vendors. She worked to realize the vision of faculty for new materials, including a black soldier fly fact sheet with research associate Devon Brits, a “Feel a Bug” area and banner with research associate Korey Pham, and a “Bug Eating” banner with Assistant Professor Nathan Lord. She also participated in the setup of AgMagic for the Central Region in 2018 and a 2018 strategy meeting at the site of AgMagic on the River at Docville Farm in Violet, Louisiana.

B. Leadership Roles/Interactions with Professionals

- **Assistant director title:** At the beginning of 2023, Hare earned the title of assistant director of communications for graphic design and publications. In this role, Hare is charged with supervising three full-time faculty positions on a team of eight people, with two student workers. This came after an initial leadership period in which Hare was asked to take on additional duties, including leading team meetings and managing publications workflow, beginning in the fall of 2021. At the start of Hare's hire in 2017, she was tasked with handling projects for the LSU AgCenter and College of Agriculture. She moved from managing her own projects to managing project requests and deadlines for the team. Hare fields questions regarding publications procedures, assesses graphic design requests, assigns numbers to publications and distributes tasks to staff while taking on a high volume of design jobs.
- **Performance evaluations:** In 2023, Blanchard invited Hare to provide input on performance evaluations for Hare's direct reports, as well as other team members.
- **Hiring committees:** Hare serves on hiring committees for the communications unit and College of Agriculture. She also writes job descriptions to fit departmental needs. Committee activity includes the following:
 - **Assistant communications specialist for graphic, digital and multimedia design (2023):** Hare has served on a committee with Blanchard and McCallum to fill two LSU AgCenter full-time faculty roles.
 - **Assistant communications specialist, editor and writer (2022):** Hare served on a committee with Blanchard and Peveto in filling this LSU AgCenter full-time faculty role.
 - **Assistant communications specialist for graphic, digital and multimedia design (2021, fall):** Hare served on a committee with Blanchard and McCallum in filling this LSU AgCenter full-time faculty role.
 - **Assistant communications specialist for graphic, digital and multimedia design (2021, spring):** Hare served on a committee with Blanchard, McCallum and former publications, design and Online Store coordinator Ana Iverson in filling this LSU AgCenter full-time faculty role.
 - **Communications coordinator, LSU College of Agriculture (2020):** Hare served on a committee with Blanchard, former Assistant Dean of Recruitment and Development Amanda Martin, past manager and current Assistant Director of Recruitment Henry Hebert and manager of Internships & Student Engagement Ashley Grant to fill this full-time College of Agriculture role.
- **Management of transitions:** The publications team has undergone changes in staffing, most notably during 2021 to present, as the result of one retirement and one departure. During this time, Hare has served as a source of continuity, providing institutional knowledge that can require years of acclimation. In addition, when transitioning to her role as assistant director, Hare scheduled one-on-one meetings with direct reports to provide assessments and establish expectations and comfort.

Hare also assisted with the transition of AgMagic from communications unit ownership to 4-H Youth Development, working with instructor and incoming program lead Hannah Devall. She explained the setup process, recommended timelines, coordinated the transference of physical assets and provided modifications to complex site maps.

- **Personnel assessments and department recommendations:** Hare is able to identify areas of strength and need and can strategize for solutions. In 2023, she provided a detailed assessment of the publications team to upper management and administrators to recommend personnel changes. This resulted in a new structure that includes an e-commerce role.
- **Accounting forms:** In 2023, Hare assisted in the creation of new language for form PUR522 to clarify and communicate policy effectively. This form regulates the usage of promotional and other items displaying the LSU AgCenter logo. Hare worked with a team consisting of brand manager McCallum, as well as accounting services Director Jan Bernath and procurement managers Karen Leblanc and Jennifer Girod to help reach consensus.

In addition, Hare provides branding approvals via the PUR522 form for internal clients such as the Department of Entomology, SPESS, and the School of Nutrition and Food Sciences. Hare determines correct logo usage and placement on promotional items and helps those clients work with print vendors on specifications to keep the AgCenter's brand aesthetic consistent and professional.

- **Work volume:** One of Hare's biggest assets is the capacity to handle a large volume of work, especially during staff shortages. Records show that productivity for Hare went from 60% of jobs among three publications employees to 90% of design work amid two vacant positions.
- **Vision/strategy:** Hare has increasingly been able to act as a strategist and looks for opportunities for improvement. One of her biggest priorities is to update the publications job-tracking system and migrate it from outdated databases hosted on impractical servers to a web-based platform. She has consulted with IT and performed hours of research to recommend a new system.
- **LSU AgCenter templates:** Hare worked with publications team members McCallum, Iverson and retired graphic designer and Professor Betsy Neely in 2019 to develop design templates for company usage. Those include posters, push cards and PowerPoint slides. These high-demand assets create an avenue for agents, faculty and staff to generate their own designs within company branding protocols. Hare also applied ADA compliance to these documents, readying them for posting on the team's SharePoint site.
- **Public relations:** Hare represents the LSU AgCenter when opportunities arise:
 - **"[LSU AgCenter training managers for the future](#)" article:** Hare was featured in an article on the LSU AgCenter's inaugural Management Development Institute (MDI) program.
 - **ACE Edge digital newsletter "ACE Member Happenings" (April 2023):** Hare was mentioned for professional and personal achievements.

C. Leadership in Integration of New and Emerging Technologies/Procedures

Technical Purchases

- **Topaz Labs:** Hare secured the latest in artificial intelligence (AI) technology in order to improve the availability of photo assets for the publications team. Those include Gigapixel AI, Sharpen AI and Denoise AI from Topaz Labs. The software uses AI to improve poor-quality photos, which are frequently submitted to staff. The programs have significantly improved available assets for designers, as many submitted photos are specific to the LSU AgCenter, negating the use of generic stock images.
- **TPGi Color Contrast Analyzer:** Hare secured the use of this program so designers can check their documents for color contrast in order to pass ADA requirements.
- **Stock assets:** Hare compared paid stock art services for the most economical, useful option and helped to acquire Shutterstock. She also recommends reliable free sites to users.
- **Hardware:** In order to meet equipment needs of new staff and replace aging equipment for existing staff, Hare researches the best options for laptops, monitors, docking stations and accessories and makes recommendations. She has worked with IT staff to secure an array of Dell products.

ADA Compliance

- **Learning and tutorials:** Hare finds reliable resources for ADA compliance learning, including LinkedIn Learning, YouTube and Deque Systems, as well as ACE virtual learning sessions. She helps to train incoming staff on compliance as an integral part of publication creation in Adobe InDesign.

Technology Monitoring

- **Adobe and other design products:** Adobe, the No. 1 professional graphic design suite, continually updates its software. Hare keeps current on these updates through the cloud app, leveraging them to improve everyday performance. Additionally, Hare monitors competing companies such as Canva and Corel and attends company IT trainings to learn about options such as Adobe Express.

Job Tracking and Archiving Procedures

- **Project request form revisions (February 2022; June 2023):** Hare has made two significant revisions to the department's project request form, which is in PDF format and posted to SharePoint. She eliminated unnecessary fields and clarified publications requests for the Online Store, including routing information on the distribution portion. Hare also added hyperlinks on the form to publication-related procedures for easy reference.
- **Archiving form revisions (October 2022):** As part of the archiving process, designers are required to complete a document that contains job specifications for record-keeping and future use. Hare eliminated several unnecessary fields in order to reduce time spent on paperwork.
- **State reporting:** Hare has increased the amount of numbered publications tracked by staff over previous years, giving reporting agencies and administrators a more accurate view of the volume of graphic design work. Under Hare's guidance, 2023 is the first year the state reporting deadline has been met ahead of schedule.

D. Professional Presentations/ Communications Training and Teaching

- **Clover College — Graphic Design: A Visual Language (2018, 2019, 2022, 2023) —**
Hare has collaborated with McCallum and other design staff throughout the years on this two-day summer session for approximately 15 to 20 high school students that provides hands-on learning for those interested in a career in graphic design. Pre-COVID, Hare coordinated tours of The Advocate newspaper's offset printing facility in 2018 and 2019. Post-COVID, Hare helped McCallum make adjustments to the curriculum. With the determination that close quarters in van transportation would not be a reliable option, the two modified the program to feature a walking-distance tour of the LSU School of Art. Hare also helped develop a classroom-based curriculum in which she, McCallum and communications coordinator/ animator Matt Faust lectured on graphic design. The end of the session culminated with a logo-creation activity for an imaginary company, with the most recent session featuring a prompt written by Hare.

Impact/Response: This annual session is popular among students, and evaluations are positive.

Thank you for all that you did to make this dynamic educational session a very positive experience. As you can tell from the attached evaluation, the youth learned a lot and had a great time during your Clover College session. Each year, Clover College upholds high quality standards because of the willingness of individuals like you to give their time and talents to our young people. Diversity champions page is an important tribute to faculty and grad students making change happen. Good design elements: clean, consistent type styles, good white space, most big stories in neat spreads. Special headlines, pretty pull quotes, and sidebars. Thin rules and framing devices help divide up stories and photo pages. Even tiny names on a chart are clear and readable. Ad on back cover has great graphic style to end the book nicely. A very attractive publication, packs a lot of material and gets the wow factor in there among many tight squeezes!

Evaluative Comments: This is a very nice cover. The image of the girl involved in a science experiment is attention-grabbing — especially since it's not the usual livestock 4-H photo. The duotone look of the photo creates a nice contrast with the clover and typography. The die-cut really sets this cover off — it would be nice to be able to see an actual publication instead of just a PDF. Great job!

Role: In 2018, Hare transformed Development's 20-page Advances newsletter to a 40+ page magazine called [The Stately Oak](#). The publication was to be modeled after an expensive magazine with perfect binding, uncoated paper and state-of-the art photography. While the team lacked a large budget, Hare was able to create a quality piece by sourcing stock art, scheduling photography sessions and creating illustrations.

Impact/Response: This piece gives the AgCenter a tool to show donors the impact of their contributions, as well as an incentive to be recognized. This is one of multiple publications Hare has transformed into an award-winning piece.

After the first issue was published, former Senior Director of Development and Corporate Engagement Director Lindsey Fussell relayed the response:

I just got off the phone with Rick Sivicek who was singing the praises of The Stately Oak and the story about his gift. He was so impressed with how great it was and how accurate the details were captured. He said it made him tear up reading it. Thank y'all for your work on pieces like this that recognize our alumni and donors in such a special meaningful way.

Also exciting — he asked me to send him further information on chairs and professorships after seeing the list in the magazine. He said it is something he is interested in potentially pursuing in the future now that his scholarships are complete. Great pieces like these create great stewardship that no doubt drives further giving — thank y'all!

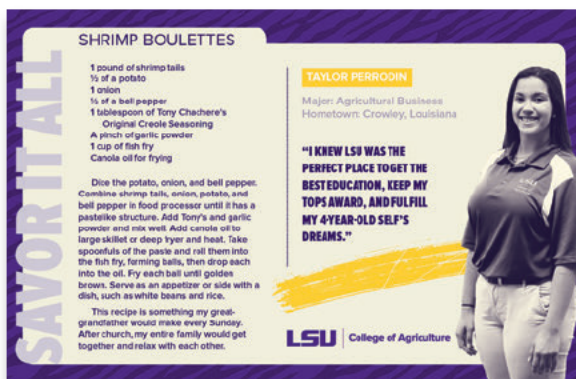
