Please submit the personal data form with handmade garment and/or decorated shirt by November 26. Data forms for Ready-to-Wear division are also due.



A. Clothing Construction Categories

1. Apron
2. Tops or Bottoms
3. Complete outfit

(A complete outfit is defined as an outfit that can stand alone. All pieces of the outfit must be constructed by the 4-H'er.)

**The Best of Show- Cotton award will be given to the best garment made of 100% cotton regardless of category entered.*

Scorecard:

Construction	40 points
Appearance	60 points
Total	100 points



B. Decorated Shirt Contest Categories

1. Shirts promoting 4-H
2. Other

Rules

1. Shirts to be decorated may be purchased ready-made or be handmade. If handmade, shirts should be made by the 4-H'er.
2. Any type of shirt may be used.
3. Shirts may be decorated using fabric paint, appliqués or any other suitable method. All shirts are to be decorated by the 4-H'er.
4. Price of shirt and price of decoration (design) must be included on personal data form.



Scorecard

1. Quality of design (durability, neatness of work, etc.)	40 points
2. Originality and creativity of design	20 points
3. Quality of shirt (construction, fiber content, etc.)	20 points
4. Total price of shirt (affordable, wise consumer decision)	10 points
5. Appearance judging	10 points
Total:	100 points

C. Ready-to-Wear Contest

Rules

1. Categories include grades 4-5, grades 6-8 and grades 9-12.
2. Select ready-made garment(s) suitable for any occasion. Complete data forms and submit forms on November 26.
3. Contestants will judge 3 classes of ready-to-wear garments with 4 garments in each class. Classes will be ranked first choice, second choice and third choice and written reasons will be given. Classes will be judged on overall quality, appearance and construction details as well as suitability of fiber content, care and price in relation to the given situation.

Data forms	50 points
(knowledge exhibited, budgeting of money, reason for selection, label information and cost)	
Judging/Reasons	50 points
Total	150 points

D. Consumer Decision Making Contest

Rules:

1. Categories include grades 4-5, grades 6-8 and grades 9-12.
2. Contestant will judge 3 classes of consumer products or services with 4 items in each class. Classes may include big ticket items, repeat purchase items, financial products or services, or contractual services. Classes will be ranked first choice, second choice and third choice and written reasons will be given. Rankings should be made based on given situation, product labels, warranties, product standards, workmanship, cost, hidden costs, services, durability, maintenance, environmental impact, product disposal, product care and vendors.

Awards

All contestants will receive ribbons. First, second and third place winners will receive cash awards. A Best of Show - Cotton award will be given to the best handmade 100% cotton garment.
