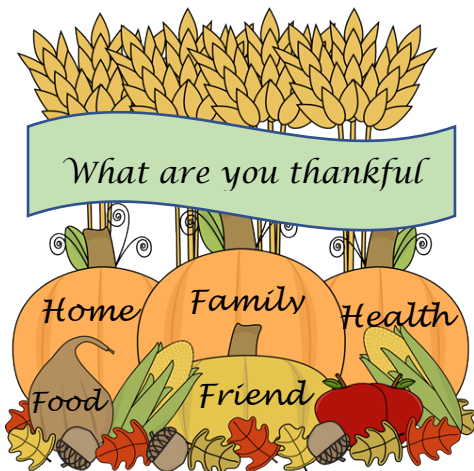

**Deadline is November 10.**

Rules and regulations:

- All photos must relate to agriculture.
- Photos must be taken by individual listed on entry label (get a label from your leader).
- Entry label must include name, parish, grade, and category.
- Photos entered must have been taken during 2021 and in Louisiana.

- All entries must be 8"x10" (color or black and white), no other sizes will be accepted.
- Each photo must include a one-line title.
- You are limited to enter only one photo in each of the categories listed.
- Entries cannot be duplicated.
- Ink jet prints acceptable.

Categories:

- I. Farm Animals
- II. Horticulture (flowers & gardens), Plants, or Crops
- III. Any Other Agriculture (like farm machinery, barns, silos, hen house, etc.)
