5. Include each Service Information Sheet and each month's service report in your final Vice President's Report to be turned in at Achievement Day.
5. The report should be assembled in a sturdy binder. The 4-H record book cover is ideal. **DO NOT INCLUDE NEWSPAPER ARTICLES, ANNOUNCEMENTS OR ANY OTHER SUPPORTING MATERIAL.**

Planning: The officer team met with our 4-H leader to plan out the 4-H year. This year our club wants to do a recycling program. Someone suggested the marker recycling drive. We can deliver a marker collection box to every teacher's classroom so the whole school can participate for the school year. We are working with administration on prizes that we can give out for the most markers.

Promotion: We decorated recycling informational posters and put them up around school. At our 4-H club meeting, members designed labels for each marker collection box so students were reminded to place dried out markers in the box instead of throwing them away. Certain weeks we will have a contest for the most markers of a certain color collected will win a small prize. The classroom that collected the most will get a bigger prize at the end of the year.

Description of Project: 4-H is doing a parish wide marker recycling drive. Collecting dried up markers to send them off to Crayola to recycle them instead of dumping them into the trash. Each classroom will be able to participate in this school wide project. They can bring in dried up markers from home as well. Each month we will have 4-H members visit the classrooms and collect the markers. We will report the total number of markers collected each month at the club meeting.

Recap of Project: Our project started in November. We have collected markers for one month now. So far we have collected 142 markers. Our orange and brown marker collection for the fall was a success! We are excited about our red and green marker contest this month. The younger students like being apart of the 4-H projects. They can't wait to join 4-H in 4th grade.
