In School:

Through the 4-H Program, members will participate in monthly meetings, that will center around a fully engaged, educational focus. Members will explore hands-on educational activities relating to Agriculture, Healthy Living, Citizenship, and other SET (Science, Engineering, and Technology).

Club Meetings are designed to engage and inform members while assisting in developing their potential for career success as they grow and learn about leadership, citizenship, and character.

Project Club:

East Baton Rouge 4-H offers individual project clubs that meet outside of the school setting. These special clubs provide hands-on, in-depth training in a specific interest. As a member, your child is welcome to be part of any of the offered project clubs.

- ***Shooting Sports Club:*** learn marksmanship and safety with four disciplines including air pistol, air rifle, shotgun, and archery.
- ***Livestock Club:*** learn about raising animals, big and small, and how to properly care for them along the way.
- ***Horse Club:*** learn about caring for horses and how to become a better horseman.
- ***Backyard Buddies:*** learn how to care for small critters like chickens and rabbits in comfort of your backyard.
- ***Jr. Leadership Club:*** An extracurricular club in which 4-Hers ages 13-17 learn more about citizenship and leadership, while being engaged in bettering their communities.
- ***Beekeeping Club:*** Learn about honey bees. Members will also get hands-on experiences in the art of beekeeping.
