Friday, October 26, 2012


Rules:

- 1) Leaves must be collected during the current school year.
- 2) Submit a notebook of 15 pages of leaves, one leaf per page.
- 3) Tape each leaf on a separate piece of construction or copy paper.
- 4) Identify each leaf using a pen, pencil or marker.
Be specific when identifying leaves. For example, if a leaf is from a Southern Red Oak tree, write *Southern Red Oak*, not just *oak*. If the leaf is from a Longleaf Pine tree, write *Longleaf Pine*, not just *pine*.
- 5) Write contestant's **name, school** and **grade** on the front cover of the notebook.
