Audience Age:	Modify to fit any age group.
Activity Time:	15-20 minutes (time can be modified)
Area:	Inclusion, Tolerance, Kindness, Anti-discrimination, Bullying prevention
Objectives:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · To create a respectful and tolerant environment · To promote inclusion among children at a young age

Activity Suggested Timeline	Minute 0-3 – Opener Minute 3-10 – Activity Minute 10-15 – Reflection activity
Engage/Opener:	<p>Have you ever heard an adult say, “you can’t judge a book by its cover?” It is a statement that teaches children that books are much more than what the cover shows us. The same can be said about people. We are much more than what others may see. We will now play a fun and exciting game of “Beanboozled!” Each player will take turns spinning the spinner and whichever bean it lands on, you must find that bean. But be careful, as it may not be the flavor you thought!</p>

Experience/Activity:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · The presenter will introduce the activity using the previous text (Engage/Opener) · The participants will then take part in the activity. · The participants will then give their reflection activity
Explain:	<p>The main aim of this project is to build the children’s sense of inclusion among all people, as you can’t “judge a bean by its color”. The same is true with people. We recommend using this activity with young children as they will have the most fun and they will be taught at a younger age to be more tolerant of those with disabilities or different ethnicities, but teenagers will also enjoy it!</p>
Sharing Processing Generalizing Application:	<p>Reflection Have members compare their ideas of Inclusion before and after the activity. Try to focus on what they learned following the activity and how they can equate what they learned to the real world.</p>
