Record Book Requirements

We will continue the procedures that were implemented in the last few years for members' record books. These guidelines are as follows:

4th/5th Graders

- Must submit the project books (no "Portfolio/Member's Record Book" is required)
- **4th & 5th Grade Discovering/Exploring 4-H Books:** Complete the entire project book including the story. Include pictures of themselves doing various activities throughout the year. Adding pictures will boost their SCORE!

6th –12th Graders

- MUST submit a **4-H Portfolio** including (up to) 3 years of work and attach their project book.
- Activity guides are a replacement for project books. Each activity guide that is turned in must be included in Section 2 4-H Project Overview in the Portfolio. All completed **activity guides and project books must also be submitted to the parish for judging.**
- Use the new updated Format for Portfolios posted on the website. It is a digital form which you will need to print out to turn in.

Record Book Covers

- All record book information for 4-H'ers and leaders will be posted on the Lafayette 4-H website. This information includes the 6th-12th "4-H Portfolio", guidelines for completing record books and record book cover sheets. The record book cover sheets are to be attached to a completed record book before they are turned in to the office. All 6th– 12th grade books must be in a three-hole punch folder. 4-H folders are available for \$3.00 per folder (this is optional).

The second session will be held for members in 4th and 5th grades working on Discovering the World of 4-H and Exploring the World of 4-H projects from **1:00-3:00 p.m. at the Lafayette Public Library- West Regional Branch (501 Old Spanish Trail- Scott).**

If you would like assistance with your project books, you should make an effort to attend the workshop sessions.

Golden Clover Award

We are offering the 4-H Foundation Golden Clover Award (formerly Award of Excellence) for Junior 4-H Members. Awards will be presented at our 4-H Honors Program to outstanding Junior 4-H Members. To qualify, a 4-H'er must meet these requirements:

1. Under 14 years of age on January 1st, 2025.
2. Have at least two (2) years of 4-H club work including award year
3. Score at least 250 points on application and scorecard
4. In either the 7th or 8th grade
5. Can only win award once

Scorecards were mailed to 4-H Members in mid-November. They are to be returned to the 4-H office no later than Friday, December 13th.



Emerald Achievement Award & Honor Cord

4-H Emerald Achievement Awards (formerly Key Club Awards) in Louisiana are given to outstanding high school 4-H'ers. To qualify, 4-H'ers must be 15 years of age as of January 1st, 2025, must have three (3) years of club work, and have completed one year of Junior Leader work.

The "4-H Honor Cord" letter with the link to the online applications to be awarded to graduating seniors were mailed out. Seniors must have been in 4-H for three years of their high school career, participated in at least one state event and a Member in good standing. This award can only be won once in a 4-H'er's career.

Both applications were mailed to 4-H members in mid-November and are due in the 4-H office by Friday, December 13th.

Junior Leader Club

It's not too late to join Lafayette 4-H's Junior Leader club, a club made up of 8th-12th grade 4-H members from across Lafayette Parish. Do you know a teen that would like to be involved in the community in a leadership role, but just not sure how to go about it?

Hi 4-H Members!

I'm back again as promised and am checking on your 4-H work. How is that book coming along? I made lots of suggestions in the November Hotline and if you finished all of the work, you're doing great!

December is a good month to work on some of the pages toward the front of the book. Last month, I suggested that you get a head start. If you haven't started, now is the time. This month, in both the Discovering the World of 4-H Book (pages 10-19) and in the Exploring the World of 4-H book (pages 13-22), you will start on the importance of being

a role model citizen in the "Citizenship" section on pages 10-19. In this section, you will learn about character education, communication, and demonstrations, as well as theater arts. Citizenship focuses on 4-H members becoming well-informed citizens who are engaged in their communities. This is done through civic education, public speaking, and community service. There are activities in this section that relate to the "Six Pillars of Character," identifying true friends, evaluating your character, tips on giving a speech and a demonstration, as well as artistic expression. Use the holidays to catch up on activities. In January, finish the Science, Engineering and Technology Section as we target our outdoor skills project areas of ATV, gun, and boating safety. I encourage you to be adventurous in learning how to care for livestock animals and pet projects. You can get started on these if you want to. Our program in December will tie directly into completing your book with tips on achieving your goal of a completed book. Remember to keep your record book neat and clean and decorate it if you wish.
